

Come Walk the Camino de Santiago With Me

A few years ago, I walked 200 km of the Camino de Santiago with my son. It was something we had talked about doing “someday”... ever since watching *The Way*, starring Martin Sheen and written and directed by his son, Emilio Estevez. If you haven’t seen it, the film beautifully explores family, grief, aging, and the quiet courage required to keep going. It also introduces viewers to the ancient network of pilgrimage routes across Europe that lead to the tomb of St. James the Apostle in Santiago de Compostela, Spain.

While the full Camino Francés stretches roughly 780 km and takes 30–40 days to complete, my son and I chose a more manageable route. We still earned our Compostela certificate by walking the final 100 km into Santiago. We stayed in simple pilgrim accommodations, shared meals with fellow peregrinos – it’s what pilgrims are called on the Camino - and met unforgettable people from around the world. Some days were joyful, others were difficult, but each one felt meaningful. September blessed us with beautiful weather, and we savored every café stop, every quiet stretch of trail, and every unexpected conversation.

Along the way, we met many pilgrims walking their second, third, or even fourth Camino. They spoke of longing to return to the road, to the simplicity of life without screens, noise, or constant demands. There is something pure about following a path that winds through orchards, farmland, forests, and bustling towns, all pointing toward the Cathedral where the remains of St. James are said to rest. When I finished, I believed it would be my one and only Camino. I said goodbye to Spain with a full heart, grateful for an experience that changed me as deeply as the character in the film.

But then something happened. I kept thinking about the people I met, the stories shared, the spiritual encounters, the fellowship, and the quiet moments of grace. And I realized: I want to go back.

So I am.

A New Pilgrimage in 2026

In partnership with Nativity Pilgrimage, I will be leading a 100 km walk from Sarria to Santiago de Compostela, with an additional pilgrimage to Fátima in Portugal, where 70,000 people witnessed the “Miracle of the Sun” and where Santos, Francisco, and Jacinta experienced monthly apparitions of Mary.

Dates: September 20 – October 2, 2026

Cost: \$4,999 per person (double occupancy)

The trip is all-inclusive:

- Round-trip flights from Boston
- All lodging (more comfortable than the “albergues” I stayed in!)
- Breakfast and dinner daily
- All transfers and transportation
- Luggage transport between walking stages
- Medical insurance

Unlike the characters in *The Way*, you won’t need to carry everything on your back. Just the essentials: water, a rain poncho, snacks, and an open heart.

A Spiritual Journey, Not Just a Trip

Because this is a pilgrimage, we will celebrate Mass in several locations and gather for evening prayer and reflection. Together we’ll explore themes such as letting go, discipleship, personal origin stories, and the meaning of pilgrimage itself. The Camino is a metaphor for life: it uplifts, challenges, simplifies, and invites transformation.

We will travel with a small group of up to 20 pilgrims. Before departure, we’ll meet several times—both in person and via Zoom—to prepare, build community, and answer practical questions about training, attire, footwear, weather, and more.

COME WALK THE CAMINO DE SANTIAGO WITH DEACON REY






You may have heard that during our last winter storm, a large tree fell on our Rectory.


STATIONS OF THE CROSS



THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

READING 1.....EXODUS 17:3-7

In those days, in their thirst for water, the people grumbled against Moses, saying, "Why did you ever make us leave Egypt? Was it just to have us die here of thirst with our children and our livestock?" So Moses cried out to the LORD, "What shall I do with this people? a little more and they will stone me!" The LORD answered Moses, "Go over there in front of the people, along with some of the elders of Israel, holding in your hand, as you go, the staff with which you struck the river. I will be standing there in front of you on the rock in Horeb. Strike the rock, and the water will flow from it for the people to drink." This Moses did, in the presence of the elders of Israel. The place was called Massah and Meribah, because the Israelites quarreled there and tested the LORD, saying, "Is the LORD in our midst or not?"

READING 2.....ROMANS 5:1-2, 5-8

Brothers and sisters:

Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand, and we boast in hope of the glory of God.

And hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

For Christ, while we were still helpless, died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us.

VERSE BEFORE THE GOSPEL

Lord, you are truly the Savior of the world;
give me living water, that I may never thirst again.

GOSPEL..... JOHN 4:5-15, 19B-26, 39A, 40-42

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink."

His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?"

—For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.

Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, 'you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water?

Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?"

Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.

"I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem."

Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem.

You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth."

The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ;

when he comes, he will tell us everything."

Jesus said to her,

"I am he, the one who is speaking with you."

Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him.

When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days.

Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."






