



## From the Desk of Deacon Alan Doty

### The Book of the Gospels: Christ Speaking to His People

When you see the Book of the Gospels carried in the entrance procession at Mass, you witness one of the Church's most beautiful traditions. This book contains only the Gospel readings—nothing else. It is often beautifully bound because it holds the words spoken by Jesus during His earthly ministry.

From the earliest days of Christianity believers treated these words with special reverence. The Church teaches that when the Gospel is proclaimed at Mass, Christ Himself speaks to His people.

That is why the Book of the Gospels is not carried casually. It is brought into the church with care and dignity, held slightly elevated and facing the people. The Word of God is not hidden away, it is not private. It moves among us. It walks with us. It is meant to be heard, received, and lived.

If present the deacon carries the Book of the Gospels in the entrance procession. At his ordination, the bishop places this book in the deacon's hands and gives him these words:

“Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you have become. Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach.”

A herald is not the author of the message; he is the one entrusted to proclaim it clearly and faithfully. This is the heart of the deacon's liturgical ministry. When a deacon carries the Book of the Gospels at Mass he is not simply moving a book from one place to another. He is living the mission he received at ordination. If a deacon is not present, the Book of the Gospels is placed on the altar before Mass begins.

This procession with the Book of the Gospels has very ancient roots. Early Christian liturgies in both East and West describe this moment with great solemnity. In the Eastern Catholic Churches, the “Little Entrance” with the Gospel Book is still one of the most dramatic moments of the liturgy. Our Roman Rite has preserved this tradi-


tion as well, reminding us that the Gospel is the high point of the Liturgy of the Word.

When the procession reaches the altar, the Book of the Gospels is placed upon it with reverence. This is more than decoration. The altar represents Christ, and placing the Gospel Book upon it reminds us of an important truth: Christ is present in His Word just as He is present in the Eucharist. Word and Sacrament both reveal the same Lord.

If a deacon is present, he proclaims the Gospel. Just before the Gospel is read, the priest or deacon takes the Book of the Gospels, raises it high, and carries it to the ambo. Sometimes candles and incense accompany this moment, signaling that something sacred is about to happen.

When the Gospel is proclaimed, the Lord speaks. The Church stands to listen.

The next time you are at Mass and see the Book of the Gospels carried through the church take a moment to notice what is happening. Christ is coming to speak to His people. The Church lifts His Word before us, and the deacon—herald of the Gospel—proclaims the saving Gospel entrusted to him on the day of his ordination.







## FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

### READING 1.....1 SAMUEL 16:1B, 6-7, 10-13A

The LORD said to Samuel: “Fill your horn with oil, and be on your way. I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem, for I have chosen my king from among his sons.”

As Jesse and his sons came to the sacrifice, Samuel looked at Eliab and thought, “Surely the LORD’s anointed is here before him.”

But the LORD said to Samuel: “Do not judge from his appearance or from his lofty stature, because I have rejected him. Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the LORD looks into the heart.”

In the same way Jesse presented seven sons before Samuel, but Samuel said to Jesse, “The LORD has not chosen any one of these.”

Then Samuel asked Jesse, “Are these all the sons you have?”

Jesse replied, “There is still the youngest, who is tending the sheep.”

Samuel said to Jesse, “Send for him; we will not begin the sacrificial banquet until he arrives here.”

Jesse sent and had the young man brought to them. He was ruddy, a youth handsome to behold and making a splendid appearance.

The LORD said, “There—anoint him, for this is the one!”

Then Samuel, with the horn of oil in hand, anointed David in the presence of his brothers; and from that day on, the spirit of the LORD rushed upon David.

Take no part in the fruitless works of darkness; rather expose them, for it is shameful even to mention the things done by them in secret; but everything exposed by the light becomes visible, for everything that becomes visible is light.

He answered and said, “Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?”

Jesus said to him, “You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he.”

He said, “I do believe, Lord,” and he worshiped him.
