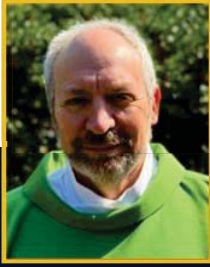

From the Desk of Deacon Richard Raab

Join us for the Triduum

Can you believe that Easter is just two short weeks away. If feel like we just celebrated Ash Wednesday. I pray your Lenten journey is going well. Soon we will celebrate the most holy and important days in the Church. Starting on Thursday evening of Holy Week we begin the Sacred Triduum which is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins.

The evening Mass on Holy Thursday is called *The Mass of the Lord's Supper*. The Church commemorates the institution of the Eucharist, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, and the institution of the priesthood. This Mass concludes with the procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose". We stay with Jesus for a time just like He asked his Apostles to "stay and pray" with Him in the Garden of Gethsemane.

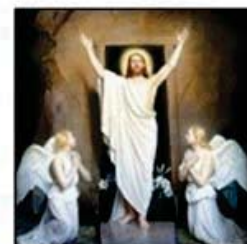
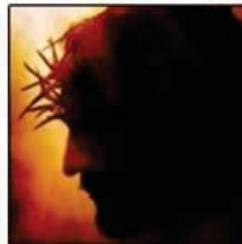
Good Friday is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus, out of love for each of us, died for the sins of the world. It is a solemn day of mourning and prayer and is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass and is the only day of the year on which no Masses are offered. On this day Christ is in the tomb.

Holy Saturday is still a day of fasting and sorrow before the Easter Vigil begins that evening. We recall, with Mary and the disciples, that Jesus died and was separated from them for the first time as He lay in the tomb. The

faithful often continue their Good Friday fast through Holy Saturday.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church calls Jesus' descent into the realm of the dead "the last phase of Jesus' messianic mission," during which he "opened heaven's gates for the just who had gone before him." Before Holy Saturday, there were **no** souls enjoying the beatific vision of God in heaven!

Easter Triduum



A vigil Mass is held after nightfall on Holy Saturday, or before dawn on Easter Sunday, in celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. This is called the Easter Vigil: the most glorious, beautiful, and dramatic liturgy for the Church.

The vigil is divided into four parts: 1: The Service of Light, 2: The Liturgy of the Word, 3: The Liturgy of Baptism, and 4: The Liturgy of the Eucharist. This is also the Mass in which many OCIA catechumens are brought into full communion with the Catholic Church.

Easter Sunday is what we've all been waiting for! The forty days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent is in preparation for this day, when our hearts and souls can drink in deeply the culmination of the Paschal mystery: the Resurrection.

Continue your Lenten plan for just a while longer. You can do it. Consider joining us for the Triduum. There you will experience Jesus' passion, death and resurrection in a holy, solemn, and personal way that will change your life.

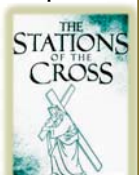

ST. FRANCIS CEMETERY SPRING CLEAN UP

As the season of renewal arrives, we will begin our annual spring cleaning of the Saint Francis Cemetery on Wednesday, April 1, 2026. We ask all families with loved ones interred in our cemetery to please visit your grave sites before that date to review your plot.

All materials that do not conform to our Cemetery Planting Rules will be removed by our cemetery crew beginning April 1st. If you wish to save any non-conforming items, please remove them from the cemetery before April 1, 2026, as the Cemetery cannot be responsible for items removed during the cleanup.

We are grateful for your understanding and cooperation as we work together to maintain our sacred grounds in a dignified and orderly manner.

As a reminder, please observe the following Cemetery Planting Rules:

- No planting of shrubs or bushes.
- No Shepherd Hooks.
- Flowers and objects must be placed in front of the stone only, and must not extend more than 12 inches out from the stone.
- No grave or flower bed enclosures of any kind, including fencing, rocks, plastic edging, or similar materials.
- Flower beds must contain peat moss and bark mulch only. No rocks, large bark chips, or rubber mulch are permitted.
- Trash barrels are for trash only. Please do not dispose of grass clippings, rocks, dirt, or edging debris in the barrels.

READING 1.....EZEKIEL 37:12-14

Brothers and sisters:

Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you. Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you.

VERSE BEFORE THE GOSPEL

I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord;
whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will never die.

GOSPEL..... JOHN 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33B-45

The sisters of Lazarus sent word to Jesus, saying,
“Master, the one you love is ill.”

When Jesus heard this he said, “This illness is not to end in

death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it.” Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.

So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was. Then after this he said to his disciples, “Let us go back to Judea.”

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet him; but Mary sat at home. Martha said to Jesus, “Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you.”

Jesus said to her, “Your brother will rise.”

Martha said, “I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day.”

Jesus told her, “I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?” She said to him, “Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world.”

He became perturbed and deeply troubled, and said, “Where have you laid him?”

They said to him, “Sir, come and see.”

And Jesus wept. So the Jews said, “See how he loved him.” But some of them said, “Could not the one who opened the eyes of the blind man have done something so that this man would not have died?”

So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay across it.

Jesus said, “Take away the stone.”

Martha, the dead man’s sister, said to him, “Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days.”

Jesus said to her, “Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?”

So they took away the stone. And Jesus raised his eyes and said, “Father, I thank you for hearing me. I know that you always hear me; but because of the crowd here I have said this, that they may believe that you sent me.”

And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, “Lazarus, come out!”

The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, “Untie him and let him go.”

Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.
