Holy Week Reflection: Surrender

“You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in You.”

St. Augustine

As we enter Holy Week, we walk with Jesus toward Jerusalem, toward the Cross, and toward the total surrender of His life to the Father. In these sacred days, the Church invites us to reflect on the deepest longing of the human heart: the longing for true peace. We all desire peace of heart, yet so often we do not experience it because our hearts are burdened with worry, fear, guilt, pride, and confusion. We search for peace in many places, but our hearts remain restless. True peace comes only when we surrender ourselves completely to God.

Jesus Himself shows us the meaning of surrender. In the Garden of Gethsemane, surrounded by fear and anguish, He prays, ***“Father, not my will, but Yours be done.”*** In that moment of complete trust, Jesus entrusts everything—His suffering, His future, His very life—into the hands of the Father.

St. Augustine reminds us that our hearts will remain restless until they rest in God. During Holy Week, we are called to examine our own hearts. At times, like the Pharisees, we may follow external religious practices yet hold back our hearts from God. Such faith cannot give lasting peace. Our interior life is often a battlefield, marked by struggles, temptations, victories, and failures. But it is precisely in these moments of weakness and confusion

that God invites us to surrender.

Rick Warren in his book, *The Purpose Driven Life*, speaks of three obstacles to surrender: **fear, pride, and confusion**. These are especially present during times of suffering. Fear makes us doubt God’s care. Pride makes us rely on our own strength. Confusion blinds us to God’s presence. Yet throughout Scripture, God speaks words of comfort to His people: ***“Do not be afraid,”*** and ***“I am with you.”*** Holy Week reminds us that God is most present when the road is darkest.

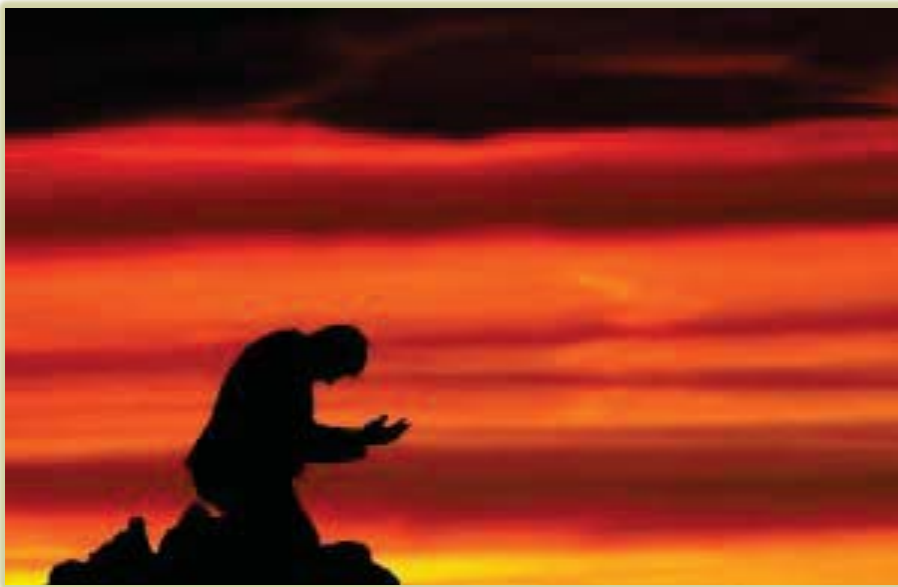
Humility opens the door to surrender. St. Augustine says, ***“It was pride that changed angels into devils; it is humility that makes human beings like angels.”*** When we humbly acknowledge our dependence on God,

grace flows into our lives. Scripture tells us that God gives grace to the humble.

We see this spirit of surrender in the lives of Abraham, David, Judith, and above all, the Blessed Virgin Mary. At the foot of the Cross, Mary stands in silence and trust, surrendering her

pain to God. She teaches us how to surrender even when we do not fully understand.

As we journey through Holy Week—through the Cross to the Resurrection—let us place our fears, our struggles, and our lives into God’s hands. May we learn from Christ to say with faith and humility, ***“Father, into Your hands I commend my spirit.”*** In this surrender, we will find true peace.

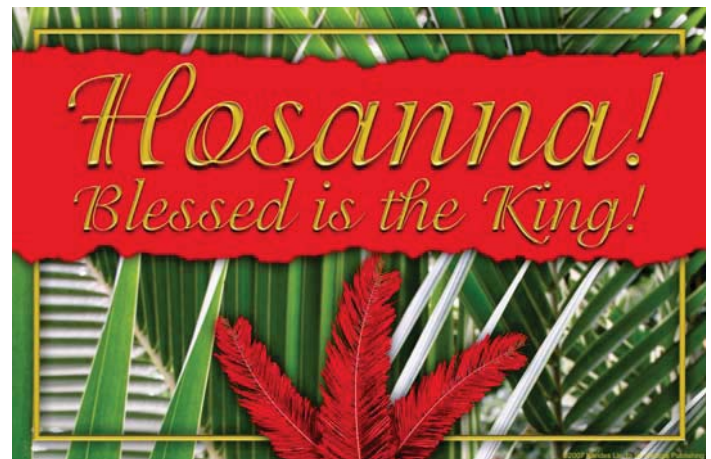

ST. FRANCIS CEMETERY SPRING CLEAN UP

As the season of renewal arrives, we will begin our annual spring cleaning of the Saint Francis Cemetery on Wednesday, April 1, 2026. We ask all families with loved ones interred in our cemetery to please visit your grave sites before that date to review your plot.

All materials that do not conform to our Cemetery Planting Rules will be removed by our cemetery crew beginning April 1st. If you wish to save any non-conforming items, please remove them from the cemetery before April 1, 2026, as the Cemetery cannot be responsible for items removed during the cleanup.

We are grateful for your understanding and cooperation as we work together to maintain our sacred grounds in a dignified and orderly manner.

As a reminder, please observe the following Cemetery Planting Rules:

- No planting of shrubs or bushes.
- No Shepherd Hooks.
- Flowers and objects must be placed in front of the stone only, and must not extend more than 12 inches out from the stone.
- No grave or flower bed enclosures of any kind, including fencing, rocks, plastic edging, or similar materials.
- Flower beds must contain peat moss and bark mulch only. No rocks, large bark chips, or rubber mulch are permitted.
- Trash barrels are for trash only. Please do not dispose of grass clippings, rocks, dirt, or edging debris in the barrels.

ADULT CONFIRMATION OPPORTUNITY –

This spring, Bishop Reed is offering an opportunity for adults who may have missed the Sacrament of Confirmation to receive it on **Thursday, April 9.**

If you were catechized in the Catholic faith and have received **Baptism and First Communion**, but were never Confirmed, now is the time to complete your initiation into the Church. In Confirmation, we are sealed with the Holy Spirit and strengthened to be Christ's witnesses, sharing His light and peace with the world.

Practicing Catholic adults **18 years and older** who have been baptized and received First Communion, but have not yet been Confirmed, are invited to participate in a preparation program beginning in January. This is an opportunity not only to prepare for Confirmation, but also to deepen your understanding of the Sacraments and our Catholic faith.

At the time of baptism, parents vow to practice their faith and provide a Catholic upbringing for the child.

Group baptisms take place on the second Sunday of the month at 1pm at St. Mary's and at Blessed Sacrament on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30pm.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

AT THE PROCESSION WITH PALMS— GOSPEL

When Jesus and the disciples drew near Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find an ass tethered, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them here to me. And if anyone should say anything to you, reply, 'The master has need of them.' Then he will send them at once."

This happened so that what had been spoken through the prophet might be fulfilled:
Say to daughter Zion, "Behold, your king comes to you, meek and riding on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

The disciples went and did as Jesus had ordered them. They brought the ass and the colt and laid their cloaks over them, and he sat upon them. The very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road. The crowds preceding him and those following kept crying out and saying:

"Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest."

And when he entered Jerusalem the whole city was shaken and asked, "Who is this?" And the crowds replied, "This is Jesus the prophet, from Nazareth in Galilee."

Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
