

## **TENDING GOD'S FLOCK**

# Fr. Glenn | 19 February 2023 Second Sunday of Lent, Year A



- 1. We recently held our first **Town Hall Meeting** as a parish last February 17 and 19. I got disheartened since there was not much of an attendance, just around 70 parishioners total. We started by showing on the overhead screens our past projects accomplished over the past few years. By holding this town hall meeting, we were able to solicit ideas from our parishioners on the direction they want our parish to take over the next couple of years. We continued by discussing the top 5 in Fr. Glenn's wish-list: evangelization, outreach, classrooms for Faith Formation kids, stained glass, and social hall with kitchen. Somebody pointed out that additional classrooms for our Faith Formation kids should be our top priority. A cost-effective way of doing this is by buying two mobile offices. This would free up the St. Martin's Hall which could then be utilized as a social hall for coffee and donuts. The stained glass would definitely enhance the beauty of our church. But right now, it's not really a high priority. However, if a family is willing to sponsor the purchase of the stained glass (cost: about \$25,000), then it should be undertaken but only as a "special project," with funds taken from private donors. I will review my notes from this meeting with my staff and members of the Finance Council, and together we will determine our best next steps.
- 2. We began the season of Lent with the imposition of ashes last Ash Wednesday (Feb 22nd). These past couple of years, we have raised a special Lenten collection by designating all donations to our **Poor Box** collection during Lent to a specific purpose. We have been doing this as part of our Parish Outreach Program. It was suggested that this year we will divide our Poor Box collection between the local conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Love More Ministries, a feeding-the-homeless program in partnership with the Nature Coast Church in Homosassa. Right now, we have 14 parishioners willing to volunteer at this feeding program. Please call our parish office if you want to help in this ministry.
- 3. In today's **gospel** (Mt 17:1-9), we have the story of the Transfiguration of our Lord. Many scripture scholars consider the Transfiguration event as an anticipation of the glory of Christ's resurrection. We read this story every Second Sunday of Lent because of its connection to baptism. In baptism, we participate in the newness of life brought about by Christ's resurrection. Baptism, then, is a call for us to be transfigured, to be transformed, to be changed. Hopefully this year's celebration of Lent will bring us to a greater appreciation of the newness of life in Christ we have received through the sacrament of baptism.

In the Gospel, Jesus is transfigured and a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased: Listen to him." Do we listen to Jesus when he asks us to take care of our

brothers and sisters who are suffering? Your gift in the St. Vincent de Paul Collection Box will help the poor to celebrate the grace of God's love this Easter.

In February, our SVDP Visitation Case Workers received 78 phone calls. They provided **support for 46 individuals** and made 24 home visits. Our volunteers delivered a total of **248 lbs. of food** and distributed a total of \$2447.96 for lodging, utilities, food, and clothing in support of the needy. They volunteered 155.9 hours and traveled 682 miles in service to our clients.

Through the generous support of our parishioners, St. Thomas's St. Vincent de Paul Society in the month of February received 96 phone calls and **provided support for 254 individuals**. Our food Pantry had 19 volunteers that worked a total of 60 hours and **distributed 2512 pounds of food** that were given out to our clients as well as 2 duffle bags, 3 blankets,1 tent, 1 umbrella, 1 rain jacket, 1 T-shirt, 2 pair of slippers, 5 coffee mugs, 1 turkey, and pastries/bread.

We are still trying to recruit volunteers to do home visits, or to help with our money and food collections. All interested parishioners are invited to attend our meetings which are held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month @ 4:30 PM in St Martin's Hall.

The Respect Life Ministry will be selling raffle tickets for a Respect Life Rosary after all masses on the weekend of March 25 and 26th. Although you may already have many rosaries, we feel this one is exceptionally different. It would also be a beautiful gift for a special someone should you win it.
