





Third Sunday of Lent, Year A



- 1. Yesterday, February 27th, the priests assigned here in Citrus County had a **Deanery Meeting** held at St. Elizabeth Ann Seaton, attended by Bishop Gregory Parkes. This year our bishop promised to attend all the deanery meetings usually held every three months. In doing so, Bishop Parkes wanted to convey his special closeness to the faithful in our area. We discussed a lot of things: the updated protocols for COVID-19; toolkits being prepared for use of parishes during the second phase (parish level) of the Eucharistic Revival; Fr. James Johnson (pastor of St. Scholastica) is retiring soon; five more young men from our diocese will be entering the seminary next school year. Bishop Parkes thanked the pastors and parishioners of the six parishes in our deanery for their support of last year's Catholic Ministry Appeal. Not only did we exceed our goal for last year, but we also had more donors participating in that campaign.
- 2. **Lent** is characterized by penance for our past sins, works of mercy for those in need, and personal preparation for the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter vigil. The traditional discipline of Lent consists of fervent prayer and reading of God's word, fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, abstinence from meat on Fridays, and works of mercy to those who have less in life. The sacrament of reconciliation (confession) should accompany our Lenten observance. Several priests will be available for confession on March 22nd, Wednesday, starting at 4:00 pm. Please plan to avail of this opportunity.
- 3. In today's **First Reading** (Exodus 17:3-7), the Israelites complained against God because they lacked water, forgetting God's kindness in liberating them from slavery in Egypt. St. Paul reminds us in today's **Second Reading** (Romans 5:1-2, 5-8) that our hope is grounded in the death of Jesus' death which saves us from sin and brings us to everlasting life. Today's **Gospel** (John 4:5-42) recounts Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well and the way this encounter changed her life. We also encounter Jesus in the sacraments as well as in others, especially those in need. Having encountered Jesus, we then begin the lifelong process of conversion. Like the Samaritan woman, we are also called to go out and share the good things that God has done for us.



The month of March is known as the Month of St. Joseph. The Solemnity of St. Joseph is Monday, March 20th.

We will celebrate the 4th Annual St. Joseph Table following the 8:00 am Mass on March 20th.

The tradition of the St. Joseph's table, or "Tavola di San Giuseppe", began in Medieval Sicily. During a drought, the people were starving and made a special devotion to St. Joseph. The rains came and the people were saved. In gratitude, they prepared a table with special foods to honor St. Joseph and to distribute to the poor.

The heart of this tradition can be found in three aspects:

- 1. Veneration: recognition of St. Joseph during Mass & at the table;
- 2. The Table: an altar of reverence and communal celebration
- 3. The Poor: gifts to help those in need.

We ask you to please bring non-perishable items to be placed on the table and given to the needy.

You are also welcome to make or bring foods to be shared in celebration with other parishioners after the Mass. Items, such as, Cannoli, Zeppole, Sfingi, olive & fig side dishes; cakes, biscotti and cookies, pasta, breads, often baked in symbolic shapes are typically found on a St. Joseph table. *Come Celebrate!*

This year, we will also have a small area to honor St. Patrick, whose feast day is March 17.


