

# Fourth Sunday of Lent, Year A



- 1. Today, March 19th, the Church celebrates the Fourth Sunday of Lent, also known as *Laetare Sunday*. Normally every March 19th we celebrate the **Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. But this year March 19 falls on a Sunday in Lent, so its celebration is transferred to the following day, March 20 (Monday). Since solemnities are not bound to some of the liturgical restrictions of Lent (such as no *Gloria* or *Alleluia* during Lent), we have here an opportunity to celebrate St. Joseph's day more festively even during this penitential season. For the fourth year in a row now, Joseph McEvoy (our pastoral assistant) is setting up again a *St. Joseph's Table* in St. Martin's Hall. One thing I noticed here is that many of our parishioners (including myself) are named Joseph or Josephine (or something similar). Please join us in celebrating this solemnity during the 8:00 am mass tomorrow. *Not to be outdone, I was informed that this year, those of Irish descent among our parishioners are also setting up a St. Patrick's Table on March 20. This means twice the fun!*
- 2. **Update on Pledges** for the Catholic Ministry Appeal 2023: This year, our parish goal for Catholic Ministry Appeal is \$61,086. As of February 27th, we received a total pledge of \$18,711.29 coming from 131 families (28% participation). If you have not made your pledge yet, please do so soon. Remember: 100% of your donation goes to your chosen ministry or program. - 3. In today's **gospel** (John 9:1-41), Jesus cures a man born blind after following our Lord's instruction to wash himself at the waters of Siloam. In a certain sense, we are like this man born blind. In baptism, we receive the light of faith which enables us to see things from the perspective of God. For this reason, in ancient times baptism was called "illumination" or "enlightenment". This light of faith is a gift given to us by Christ, who is the light of the world, the conqueror of the darkness of sin and death. Only Jesus can heal us of our spiritual blindness. Let us ask our Lord today for an increase of faith, that we may live as children of light, and that in our practice of the discipline of Lent and by our Christian witness, we may drive away the darkness of sin and death so prevalent in our world today.



The Solemnity of St. Joseph is this Monday, March 20th.

We will celebrate the 4th Annual St. Joseph Table following this Monday's 8:00 am Mass.

The tradition of the St. Joseph's table, or "Tavola di San

Giuseppe", began in Medieval Sicily. During a drought, the people were starving and made a special devotion to St. Joseph. The rains came and the people were saved. In gratitude, they prepared a table with special foods to honor St. Joseph and to distribute to the poor.

### The heart of this tradition can be found in three aspects:

- 1. Veneration: recognition of St. Joseph during Mass & at the table;
- 2. The Table: an altar of reverence and communal celebration
- 3. The Poor: gifts to help those in need.

# We ask you to please bring non-perishable items to be placed on the table and given to the needy.

You are also welcome to make or bring foods to be shared in celebration with other parishioners after the Mass. Items, such as, Cannoli, Zeppole, Sfingi, olive & fig side dishes; cakes, biscotti and cookies, pasta, breads, often baked in symbolic shapes are typically found on a St. Joseph table. *Come Celebrate!* 

This year, we will also have a small area to honor St. Patrick, whose feast day was March 17.






