

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

Fr. Glenn | 19 March 2023
Easter Sunday of our Lord's
Resurrection, Year A



- 1. **HAPPY EASTER!** Today we begin a new season in our liturgical calendar the Easter season. The whole season of Easter celebrates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. It begins a time of reflecting on how the followers of Jesus came to understand his rising from the dead.
- 2. One figure central to all the gospel accounts of Jesus' resurrection is **Mary Magdalene.** The early Christians called her "the apostle to the apostles." She was the first to break the news of the empty tomb to the disciples and the first to witness the risen Lord.
- 3. In the Philippines, we begin our Easter celebration with a ritual procession called **Salubong** (encounter), which recalls the extra-biblical encounter between the Virgin Mary and the risen Jesus. Two statues are prepared for the procession that takes place outside the church: the statue of the Virgin Mary covered with a black veil (carried by the women) and the statue of the Risen Lord (carried by the men). These two statues would meet halfway where there is a stage prepared. A young girl is usually chosen to sing Regina Caeli after which she takes off the black veil from Mary. Then the two statues are carried together in procession back to the church where the mass was celebrated. Guess what happens after mass -- a lot of eating!
- 4. The joy of the resurrection of our Lord flows over to the next fifty days of the Easter season until



Pentecost Sunday. The chanting of the Alleluia and the lighted Paschal Candle keep alive the solemn and memorable celebration of the Easter vigil. The biblical readings and prefaces used during mass remind us that the risen Christ is always present among us and that we can recognize him in the proclaimed Word of God and in the breaking of the bread (the Eucharist).





All are invited to join us for the Northern Deanery celebration of the Feast of Divine Mercy. This year the celebration will be held on April 16 at 3:00 p.m. at St. Benedict Catholic Church, located at 455 South Suncoast Blvd in Crystal River.

Jesus told St. Maria Faustina Kowalska that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened" (Diary 699). Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to confession and receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of Mercy, the Second Sunday of Easter, which is now called Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the Catholic Church.

The celebration will include the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Benediction, reading, prayer reflection, and a blessing of the Divine Mercy picture. You may bring your own image of the Divine Mercy to be blessed.

Participants are encouraged to attend regularly scheduled confessions and Sunday Mass at St. Thomas to fulfill the obligations for Divine Mercy Sunday.

Protecting Our Children
April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Child abuse remains a national problem. Abuse, even if is not fatal, robs a life and damages a child's spirit. It changes who that person is on a fundamental level. Victims are neglected, physically abused, sexually abused, and sex trafficked. For several years, rates of child abuse and child maltreatment had been either slowly declining or remaining stagnant. When the COVID-19 pandemic hit in early 2020, those rates began to rise.

Florida law requires any individual who suspects that a child has been abused by any person to report that to the Florida Abuse Hotline. Any allegations a child was abused or neglected by a caregiver will be investigated by the Department of Children and Families, while allegations of child abuse by someone other than a caregiver will be accepted at the Hotline and immediately electronically transferred to the appropriate local law enforcement agency where the child lives.

The Florida Abuse Hotline accepts reports 24 hours a day and 7 days a week of known or suspected child abuse, neglect, or abandonment and reports of known or suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a vulnerable adult. If you suspect or know of a child or adult that is in immediate danger, call 911.




Bible Study with Deacon Mark
