

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK Fr. Glenn | 11 April 2023 Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year A



- 1. **Mary, Queen of May:** The month of May is a month dedicated to Mary. This past couple of years we have kept alive in our parish this time-honored tradition of crowning Mary as Queen of heaven and earth. By crowning the statue of Mary with a crown of flowers, we recognize her role in our Lord's lifting us out of the long, cold days of winter and firmly planting our hearts in the warm and promising soil of spring. In 1859 Mary appeared to the young Belgian immigrant, Adele Brise, during which Mary identified herself as the "Queen of Heaven." In one of the Marian hymns, we address Mary: "Hail Virgin, dearest Mary! Our lovely Queen of May. O spotless, blessed Lady. Our lovely Queen of May. And now, our Blessed Mother, smile on our festal day. Accept our wreath of flowers and be our Queen of May."
- 2. Today (May 7) is a very special day to seven of our Faith Formation kids who will be receiving the Eucharist for the first time. They are: Geoffrey Boehm, Arieanna Crockwell, Isavella Flores, Viviana Flores, Camila Morrow, Everett Nothnagel and Abigail Sturdevant. Seeing them receiving the Eucharist with much fervor and devotion will hopefully bring back many happy memories of our own **First Holy Communion**. Please pray also for the parents of these children that they allow these kids to continue with their faith formation.
- 3. Jesus tells us in today's **gospel** (John 14:1-12), "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." Jesus is the way, because by following him we will surely reach our final destination eternal life with God. Jesus is the truth, because he is the perfect revelation of God given to us in human form. ST. THOMAS MINISTRIES UPDATES & REMINDERS



In the Gospel today, Jesus says "...whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father."

Through your almsgiving you are helping; far greater than you think. The money placed in the St. Vincent de Paul Money Collection Box next weekend (May 13/14) brings Christ's love and compassion to the poor.

Through the generous support of our parishioners, St. Thomas's St. Vincent de Paul Society in April was able to help many people in need. Our SVdP Visitation Case Workers received 70 calls, had 23 cases, provided support for 38 individuals, and distributed 214 pounds of Pantry food. We made 23 home visits and spent a total of \$2096.97 in support for lodging, utilities, food, and clothing for the needy. Our Teams donated 157 hours and traveled 641 miles in service to our clients.

We are still trying to recruit volunteers to do home visits or to help with our money and food collections. The St Thomas Women's Guild will have Carnations available next weekend (May 13/14) in


honor of Mother's Day. Traditionally, white carnations are for deceased Mothers, and pink carnations are for Mothers' living.
