



TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

4 June 2023 | Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, Year A Fr Glenn | written on 24 April 2023





1. June is the month of the **Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.** Its solemnity falls on June 16th this year (Friday after Corpus Christi Sunday). In honoring the Sacred Heart, we are honoring the compassion and love of Christ: his human heart, moved with pity for his flock; his divine heart, pierced for the sins of his people. From the pierced heart of Jesus, blood and water poured out, "the wellspring of the Church's sacraments."

- 2. We celebrate today the solemnity of the **Most Holy Trinity**. We believe that there are three divine persons in one God. Our Trinitarian God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) cannot be understood apart from their unity. The essential component of being in relationship with our Trinitarian God is to allow that relationship to impact all that we say and do. For your homework today, I encourage you to google a 15th century icon made by the Russian painter Andrei Rublev known as "The Hospitality of Abraham," depicting the three angels who visited Abraham and Sarah. This famous image is often referred to as the Icon of the Trinity. Check out how the Trinity is depicted in these figures.
- 3. During our baptism, we were sealed by the **sign of the Holy Trinity**. Through our baptism, we became adopted children of God, so can now call God our Father. Through baptism, we became brothers and sisters of Christ, co-heirs of the kingdom of heaven. Through our baptism, we became living temples of the Holy Spirit, so that through grace we may be able to participate in the divine life. We have received an indelible mark of the Holy Trinity from the moment of our baptism. Every time we make the sign of the cross, we renew our faith in our One and Triune God. For this reason, we begin and end our celebration of the mass always "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."


We celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, next weekend, June 10 and 11. This solemnity celebrates the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus in the consecrated elements of the Eucharist.

At all weekend Masses, we will distribute communion under both species of bread and wine. Communion from the chalice will be available from the Deacon and two Eucharistic Ministers. We encourage you to drink from the chalice, but it is purely voluntary.

Corpus Christi Sunday also marks the beginning of the second phase of the National Eucharistic Revival (NER), where the focus is at the parish level. We will have a Eucharistic procession at the end of the 8:00 am Sunday Mass, and incense will be used during this Mass. Weather permitting, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament outside, a public display of our faith and belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

ST. THOMAS MINISTRIES & JUNE CELEBRATIONS



As we celebrate the mystery of the Trinity, we also realize the mystery of how much God loves and cares for us each day. Believing in this, our lives can then overflow with thanksgiving and praise.

Your gift in the St. Vincent de Paul Poor Box will help the poor to believe in the mystery of God's love for them.

Through the generous support of our parishioners, St. Thomas's St. Vincent de Paul Society in May was able to help people in need. Our SVdP Visitation Case Workers received 87 calls, served 72 households, and made 26 home visits which provided support for 72 individuals. Our volunteers delivered 209 pounds of pantry food and spent \$3,854.81 for utilities, food, clothing, etc. Our teams donated 160 hours and traveled 724 miles in service to those in need.
