

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

30 July 2023 | 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A



- 1. First of all, I would like to thank everyone for their congratulations and well wishes on my commissioning after finishing the **Lay Pastoral Ministry Institute** (LPMI) program last June 20th at the cathedral. Those four years of LPMI formation have been challenging, but at the same time also very rewarding for me. I would highly recommend LPMI for anyone interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and in serving the local church as a lay minister. If this is something you think you would be interested in, please call the office to make an appointment with Fr. Glenn. The program begins with the Year of Discernment, and classes for this year start in September.
- 2. Beginning in September, our parish will distribute communion under **both species of bread and wine**. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian faith and it is a treasure we value. In the eucharist, we have our Lord truly, really, and substantially present body and blood, soul and divinity. To be able to do this properly, we need more volunteers to serve as Eucharistic Ministers at every weekend mass. There are seven positions for Eucharistic Ministers at the weekend masses, including the priest and deacon: four for the host, and three for the cup. We can't do this without you! Please prayerfully consider volunteering, and we will train you. It is a very rewarding experience to be able to share our Lord with others. Kindly contact the parish office to volunteer.
- 3. In today's **gospel** (Matthew 13:1-23), we hear three parables about the kingdom of heaven. It is like a valuable buried treasure that is worth more than all we have. It is like a pearl of great price that is highly sought after. And finally, it is like the net thrown into the sea which gathers all kinds of fish in. At the end of the age, the angels will separate the good from the bad. Perhaps the kingdom of heaven is not so much like a fortified city with beautiful buildings, but rather more like a place in our hearts where we receive the treasure of the Word of God and the Eucharist. May we treasure these gifts and use them well toward the realization of God's kingdom here on earth.




