
TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

13 August 2023 | 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A



- 1. I would like to invite our parishioners to join the **Eucharistic Encounter**, a special diocesan event that will take place on Saturday, 16 September 2023, at the JW Marriott in downtown Tampa on the Riverwalk. This is one way we are seeking to nurture a Eucharistic Revival in our diocese. There will be speakers, music, mass with Bishop Gregory Parkes, a procession to Amalie Arena, and food! This event is only \$5, including meals and parking! Visit EucharisticEncounter.org to learn more and to register soon before tickets sell out!
- 2. As of this writing (July 28), I was informed that we have just two more slots available in our 2023 **Mass Intentions Book.** Normally, we would wait until the beginning of October to start accepting mass requests for next year. But this year, we have decided to open the 2024 Mass Intentions Book starting September 5 (Tues). We give priority to mass requests from our registered parishioners, but we limit them to two (2) mass intentions only for weekend and holy day masses; there is no limit on the number of weekday masses you can request. Since we have limited slots for mass intentions, we encourage our parishioners to consider sponsorship for altar flowers, bread and wine, and altar candles for weekend masses.
- 3. In today's **gospel** (Matthew 14:22-33), we learn that as the disciples were rowing their boat across the lake, they encountered a storm around 3:00 am, the darkest time of the night. When everything seemed lost, Jesus appeared to them walking on the waters. Then Jesus joined them in the boat, and the wind died down. Even now, Jesus continues to come walking into our personal storms in life. Whether it is a death of a loved one, a financial problem, a health issue, or a breakdown in one's relationship, whatever storms we are facing right now, we can be sure that Jesus will come to our rescue. If we fix our eyes on Jesus, just like Peter, we, too, can walk over the waters. In whatever 3:00 am moment we may find ourselves, Jesus will come, bringing peace, strength, and salvation. We, for our part, must welcome Jesus and invite him into our boat.


The Eucharistic Encounter has Sold Out

How Jesus is Present in the Liturgy

A few months ago, in his homily during a Sunday mass, Deacon Mark posed the question: "Where is God?" After a short pause, one of our Faith Formation children, Everett, raised his hand and shouted, "Everywhere! He is everywhere."

Yes, Amen! God is indeed everywhere. The omnipresence of God is one of the first things that we learn about our faith. But when we attend mass, where is God uniquely present?

One of the key principles put forth by the Second Vatican Council is that Christ is present in the liturgy in four unique ways (referred to as the four-fold presence of Christ), namely:

- a. in the Word of God proclaimed (mass readings);
- b. in the gathered assembly (Jesus is present whenever two or three are gathered together in his name);
- c. in the priest (who leads the celebration and helps us to encounter the very presence of Christ);
- d. and preeminently in the Eucharist (where the elements of bread and wine are changed into the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus).

In the Eucharist, the bread and wine are not merely symbols of Jesus. We believe that in the Eucharist, Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present. We eat his body and drink his blood in order that we may have life within us, that we may be one with Jesus, that we may be holy as Jesus is holy.

If for you holiness seems to be a pursuit reserved only for the clergy and the religious, then may I invite you to go deeper. Spend some time in prayer or in quiet reflection. Come and adore Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament during our times of adoration (Thursday Holy Hour or First Friday Adoration). Or simply spend time with Jesus in the tabernacle (Monday thru Thursday, 8:30 am - 1:30 pm).

In addition to our daily mass at 8:00 am, we will also have the opportunity to attend Thursday Evening Mass that starts this coming Thursday, August 17, at 6:00 pm. The best way to unite ourselves with Jesus and recommit ourselves to following Him is by attending mass and receiving him in communion.

During this period of our National Eucharistic Revival, perhaps we can grow more in our faith in the Eucharist by being more generous of our time and attend at least one weekday mass in addition to our Sunday mass attendance.



Please join our Knights, along with fellow parishioners, and many others from within or outside our local community for this special and important prayer service.




