


# **TENDING GOD'S FLOCK**

# FIRST FRIDAY OF THE MONTH (SEPTEMBER 1) EUCHARISTIC ADORATION & BENEDICTION FOLLOWING THE 8 AM MASS UNTIL NOON

Our Lord waits for you to come and spend some time with Him. Eucharistic Adoration is adoring or honoring Christ fully present in the Eucharist. We know as Catholics that the Eucharist is Jesus truly and fully present - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity! Eucharistic Adoration is the contemplation of this Mystery of Christ truly present before us.

During Eucharistic Adoration, we are invited to look upon our Lord as He looks back at us. As we enjoy silence or prayer in His Presence, we open ourselves to His Grace which flows to us in a unique way through the Eucharist. Worshiping the Eucharistic Jesus brings us into a fuller relationship with Him and invites Christ to gently transform us into the person God intends us to be. In Eucharistic Adoration, we reach out to God as He ever more fervently seeks us.

During the first half-hour of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, we devote time as a group to pray for the sanctification of priests. This specific group prayer time is called the Vianney Cenacle, named after the patron saint of priests, St. John Vianney. All are welcome to join in group prayer at the next Vianney Cenacle (September 1st.). We will pray and ask God to keep all priests, especially Bishop Parkes, Msgr. Joe, Fr. Glenn, and Fr. Ron, close to the heart of our Blessed Mother Virgin Mary.





# WHAT IS THE LPMI?

The Lay Pastoral Ministry Institute (LPMI) of the Diocese of St. Petersburg is a four-year program for lay leadership formation consisting of an informal Year of Discernment, and three years of formational training. The LPMI is built upon the principles put forward by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in the document "Co-Workers in the Vineyard of the Lord: A Resource for Guiding the Development of Lay Ecclesial Ministry."

### **Goals and Objectives**

Goal 1

The LPMI will serve as a resource for preparing persons, in response to their baptismal call, for leadership and ministerial roles in the parish, the diocese, the local community, and the world.

Goal 2

The LPMI will provide opportunities for persons to acquire knowledge, develop skills, and strengthen commitment to a life of discipleship in order to be effective leaders in specific ministries.



The LPMI will encourage collaboration among LPMI participants and their pastors in order to meet the ministerial needs in their families, their parishes, the Church the Diocese, and in the world.

# **Mission Statement**

The mission of the Lay Pastoral Ministry Institute is to provide an integrated lay ecclesial ministry formation program that will prepare the laity to offer their unique gifts in service to the local church. Responding to the implications of their baptismal commitment they will

be better equipped to serve as competent leaders in the parishes of this culturally diverse diocese, ever mindful of their primary commitment to family life. In accordance with the teachings and tenets of the Roman Catholic Church, they serve as agents of evangelization and transformation in the society in which they live, as members of the Body of Christ, here in the Diocese of St. Petersburg
