

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

10 September 2023 | *23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A*



- 1. It looks like we have **younger families** joining our parish. Deacon Mark is doing more baptisms lately; more kids are getting enrolled in our Faith Formation classes. It also means we're having some babies crying during mass. We do have a small Cry Room, but it also is getting crowded in there. If you're one of those getting distracted during mass because a baby is crying, please remember what an elderly pastor once said: "If in your church there are no babies crying, then your church is dying." We're striving to be a welcoming parish, one that includes babies and young children. They belong to the Church of the present, not the Church of the future.
- 2. One of the recurring complaints I get from parishioners is about the noise in our church prior to mass. We are accustomed to a constant barrage of noise outside that sometimes we forget that we need to **observe silence** as we enter the church. We need silence (both interior and exterior) in order to pray. St. John of the Cross tells us that silence is the first language of God. Silence is important because it is in silence that we encounter God. "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:11 NAB). The next time we enter our church, let us observe silence and be ready to listen to God.
- 3. In today's **gospel** (Matthew 18:15-20), we have one of the most difficult teachings of our Lord, namely: fraternal correction. It tells us about our responsibility for one another, of being indeed our brother's keeper. We are encouraged to point out one another's faults in the name of love and concern. Through fraternal correction, we have the opportunity to learn more about ourselves and about others. We become more sensitive in dealing with other people. We learn new and better ways of coping with disappointments and hurts. We make relationships work even in the midst of differences and conflicts. This is not easy, and that is why we need to factor in God's grace in order for us to give and receive fraternal correction.

DIOCESE OF CATARMAN-PHILIPPINES

I am Father Jonathan Loverita from the Philippines. This year. my bishop, Most Rev. Emmanuel C. Trance, D.D., sent me to do the mission appeal for our diocese. Our diocese is called the Diocese of Catarman.

The Diocese of Catarman is one of the poorest in the Philippines; our children live in abject poverty, and we witness daily the violence that starvation and disease in remote areas of our diocese cause. This is the painful reality our church faces. Simple yet curable diseases due to malnutrition and the annual natural calamities that nature unkindly

inflicts on our people cause death at an early age.

Most of our villages are in the hinterlands. Seventy-five percent of the population are farmers. Six out of a hundred children die before they reach the age of one. Our area is also visited by typhoons, sometimes 33 times a year, which destroy the crops and houses made of nipa huts and bamboo. In November 2013, we were hit by the strongest typhoon ever, wherein more than 10,000 people died. We have to wait again for several years for the coconut crops to normalize, which is our only major source of living. The pandemic is still ongoing, with no vaccines available for everyone.

But we learn to survive, to hope, to pray, and to rely on God's compassion in the midst of the life and death struggles of the poor. In God's grace, we have lay leaders, religious sisters, and clergy who are dedicated to meeting the spiritual, material, and ecclesial needs of our people. God's hope assures us that his grace also motivates those with a heart for the poor to lend their prayerful and financial support to our efforts.

Your assistance is crucial to make a difference in the survival of our people. We depend on your generosity to simply live. If our proposal is approved, your help will go to the relief needs of our impoverished children and their families for the training and formation of our lay leaders and our clergy's health & retirement assistance program.
