






TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

24 September 2023 | *25th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A*


1. Sunday, September 24th is the 109th World Day of Migrants and Refugees Pope Francis in his annual message chose the theme "Free to choose whether to migrate or to stav." people migrate The reason persecution, famine, and to find a better life. Jacob migrated to Egypt because of famine. St. Joseph took the Holy Family away from persecution from Herod. Our ancestors migrated to the United States for a better life. How much better would it be if we could have stayed and made our life better? Pope Francis concludes his letter as follows; "In whatever place we decide to build our future, in the country of our birth or elsewhere, the important thing is that there always be a community ready to welcome, protect, promote and integrate everyone. without distinctions and without excluding anyone." Let us strive to be that community. As it says in the Bible, "So you too should love the resident alien, for that is what you were in the land of Egypt." (Dt 10:19)



2. Our **Gospel reading** (Matthew 20:1-15) today challenges our sense of fairness. I have been working since dawn, I should certainly be paid more than someone who has only worked an hour! It's not fair! Our cultural work ethic is if you work harder, you will get more! But the parable in the Gospel is not about that, it is about the love and salvation of our God. If we earnestly seek the Lord, we will find there is no "more" or "less" because the idea of more or less does not apply to God's love or salvation. In Isaiah, we learn that God does not think as we do. God's ways are not ours. God wants us to be with him, to work his vineyard, because he loves us. 




