

# **TENDING GOD'S FLOCK**

1 October 2023 | *26th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A* 



- 1. Today, September 6<sup>th</sup>, I informed our parishioners via a Flocknote message that Deacon Mark Manko has accepted my invitation to serve as **business manager** of our parish. As such, he will act as the steward of the physical and personnel resources of our parish. This is in addition to his present responsibilities in charge of the Evangelization and Outreach ministries. Please join me in thanking Deacon Mark for having such broad shoulders and for accepting these additional duties for the good of our parish.
- 2. During his September 4 in-flight press conference returning from his visit to Mongolia, Pope Francis outlined his vision for the upcoming **Synod on Synodality** that will take place at the




Vatican this coming October 4-28. The Holy Father emphasized that the synod should be a prayerful exercise in dialogue, touching on the problems that affect humanity today. There is a lot of confusion going on regarding this present synod. It has received a lot of negative criticism from those who claim that this synod will implement drastic changes in the Church, since it will discuss the possibility of married priests, women deacons, and the blessing of gay couples. But for Pope Francis, the priority issues of our Church today are communion, participation, and mission. Fostering communion between God and man is at the heart of what it means to be a synodal church. Our need for communion should lead to a greater participation in the life and mission of the Church. There will be a second session of this synod slated for October 2024.

3. Our **gospel** today (Matthew 21:28-32) tells us about the parable of two sons. A father told his older son to work in the vineyard. He said yes, but never went. The father also told his younger son to work in the vineyard. He said no, but later changed his mind and went. I think one of the lessons we can learn here is that the Lord allows us to make U-turns in our lives. He calls each one of us to work in his vineyard. Some of us will say Yes, while others will say No. The Lord wants us to respond Yes, and actually do our best to make sure that our words are consistent with our actions.






