

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

22 October 2023 | 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A




- 1. **Pope St. John Paul II** made an Apostolic Journey to the United States on October 4 9, 1995, with an itinerary that included Newark, Brooklyn, Yonkers, and Baltimore. The final stop on his very busy last day of the journey was to greet the seminarians at Saint Mary's Seminary in Baltimore. The Pope was greeting the seminarians when he decided to make an unplanned visit to the Blessed Sacrament.
- 2. The **security personnel** now had to check this building to ensure it was safe for the Pope to enter. So with their highly trained dogs, they swept the building paying close attention to the chapel where the Pope would be praying. These dogs were trained to locate survivors in collapsed buildings after earthquakes and other disasters. They went through the halls, offices, and classrooms before eventually being sent to the chapel where the Blessed Sacrament was.



- 3. Upon reaching the tabernacle, the dogs sniffed, whined, and refused to leave, their attention riveted on the tabernacle. The dog in the photo was trained to identify life after earthquakes. His posture and staying fixed as seen in the image is the posture that tells the rescuer that **there is life**. This dog was convinced that he discovered someone alive. And of course, we know that he did: the dog found the Real Presence of Jesus in the Tabernacle. Let us remember this reality each time we receive the Eucharist. (My thanks to Joan Wahl for sharing this story with me.)
- 4. In today's gospel (Mt 22:15-21), we find the Pharisees plotting against Jesus, trying to find fault with his teachings, and entrap him. We hear the familiar phrase, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Giving a coin to Caesar is relatively easy, but how do you repay God? Each of us belongs to God, from the moment of conception until death. Our life's journey should be one in which we repay God for this gift of life that he has entrusted to us. That repayment comes in the form of love. For love can only be repaid with love: love of God and love of neighbor.


