

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

5 November 2023 | Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A




- 1. As I write this, the **27th Annual Convocation for Priestly Renewal** is well underway at the Bethany Center in Lutz, FL. The theme chosen for our convocation this year is "National Eucharistic Revival, A Grassroots Response to God's Invitation." I always look forward to this gathering of priests every year, since this is the only occasion that the priests of our diocese gather for ongoing formation. In between lectures, meals, and prayer, we exchange stories about who is nearing retirement, our current ailments and doctors, and the latest in our present assignments. Hey, wanna swap parish next year? JK.
- 2. One of our presenters during this convocation is the **Most Reverend Andrew H. Cozzens**, the young bishop of Crookston in Minnesota. He also serves as the chair of the USCCB Committee on Evangelization and Catechetics, and in this capacity, he is the architect of the ongoing three-year National Eucharistic Revival (NER). Bishop Cozzens describes the NER as a "divine visitation" and discussed some of the things that we can do in the parish to promote the NER such as: reinvigorating worship, personal encounters, faith formation, and missionary sending. The high point of the NER is the Eucharistic Congress which will take place in Indianapolis on July 17-21, 2023.



3. The main reason why Jesus criticized the scribes and Pharisees in today's **gospel** (Matthew 23:1-12) is that Jesus noticed a discrepancy between their words and actions. How can we overcome hypocrisy? Jesus himself tells us: "The greatest among you must be your servant." In other words, we must live a life of service to others. We have to be mindful of the gap between what we say and what we do. Don't look around now for scribes and Pharisees. For if we're honest about it, there's a bit of a scribe and a Pharisee in each of us today.






