

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

26 November 2023 | Thirty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A



In the year 1925, Pope Pius XI, in his Encyclical *Quas Primas* added the Solemnity of Our LORD Jesus Christ, King of the Universe to the calendar, to be celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary time. Pope Pius's Encyclical gave Catholics hope and assured us that Christ the King shall reign forever. Jesus Christ "is the very truth, and it is from him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind." (Quas Primas, 7) This Solemnity is intended to proclaim in an effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

In November 2020, Pope Francis in his remarks at the conclusion of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, spoke thus; "I have decided, beginning next year, to transfer the diocesan celebration of World Youth Day (WYD) from Palm Sunday to Christ the King Sunday. The center of the celebration remains the Mystery of Jesus Christ the Redeemer of Man, as Saint John Paul II, the initiator and patron of WYD, always emphasized." In the United States we refer to this day as the "Global Celebration of Young People." Young people refers to youth and young adults, from the age of 12 up to 39. On this day we look to include young people in the liturgy and in the ministries. As Pope Francis said in his November 2020 remarks "Dear young people, cry out with your life that Christ lives, that Christ reigns, that Christ is the LORD! If you keep silent, I tell you the very stones will cry out! (cf. Lk 19:40).

Our **Gospel** today echoes the first reading from Ezekiel as it talks about the shepherd who separates the sheep from the goats. Saint Matthew names the Son of Man, Jesus, as the Lord of Israel. As shepherd, the LORD cares for and watches over his people. The shepherd and the sheep know one another. Both the sheep and the goats call Jesus "LORD." but Matthew makes it clear that not everyone who calls Jesus LORD will enter the kingdom of heaven. Our actions are more important than our words and God wants our actions to be mercy for the weak and vulnerable. When we appear before the King, we will not be asked about our accomplishments or our achievements, but we will be judged by what we did for the least of our brothers. As St. John of the Cross said, "In the evening of life we will be judged on love alone."

What is the New Testament evidence proving the doctrine of the Real Presence? (Part 1)

Prefigured by the signs, events, and prophesies of the Old Testament, the New Testament gives clear evidence for the doctrine of the Real Presence in three different areas: the promises of Jesus in John Chapter 6, his promises fulfilled at the Last Supper, and the belief and practices of the early Apostolic Church. Together, they form an overwhelming argument of proof for this doctrine.

John Chapter 6. This chapter begins with the miracle of the feeding of the 5000. In verses 22-47 that follow, Jesus stresses to his disciples the necessity of faith in order to accept his teaching about the Eucharist. He directs them to pursue food that doesn't perish but endures eternally and to believe in him, who the Father has sent, the true bread of God, which gives life to the world.

The Bread of Life Discourse. Beginning with verse 48, Jesus teaches that we must consume his flesh and blood as food: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst. ... I am the bread of life ... the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." (v 48-51)

These words of Jesus were understood literally (v 52), and many of his followers questioned how this could be. Jesus then repeats the literal meaning of his teaching six times in verses 53-58. As a result, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. (v 66) When asked if the Twelve also wanted to leave, St. Peter, in speaking for them said, "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." (v 68-69)

Next month, in Part 2, we'll discuss how the teachings and promises of Jesus were fulfilled at the Last Supper.
