

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

31 December 2023 | Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph , *Year B*



31 December 2023 | Feast of the Holy Family, Year B

- 1. Today we celebrate the **Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph**. I am reminded of the donation of the Holy Family statue that now graces our church, and how thankful I am for the generosity of Dolores Mottle and other parishioners, known and unknown to me, who over the years have helped grow and beautify our church. It is only by their care for the future generations of our church and our faith that we are here today, from our founders the Rev. James Hoge and those who are commemorated on the Founder's Day plaque in the narthex to all who are reading this bulletin. St. Thomas has truly been blessed.
- 2. Tomorrow, Monday, January 1, we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God**. We'll have just one Mass for this celebration, which is at 9:00 a.m. This is the Octave Day of Christmas, but since it falls on a Monday this year, the obligation to observe it as a Holy Day has been suppressed. This usually happens when Christmas falls on a Monday; it seems to condense our holy day celebrations, putting them right next to each other. Perhaps it's one way to help us remember to keep God at the center of our lives.
- 3. Our readings this weekend are full of the imagery of family. We are told in the first reading (Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14) to honor our fathers and revere our mothers. The second reading (Colossians 3:12-21) tells us how important our family is by reminding us how to treat each other this passage alone is a recipe for New Year's resolutions. Then we have in our gospel reading (Luke 2:22-40) the story of Jesus' presentation at the temple by Mary and Joseph. They followed the Jewish laws and customs, and presented their first born, Jesus, to be consecrated to the Lord. But the story focuses on Simeon, a man filled with the Holy Spirit, and Anna, a prophetess. We can see God's faithfulness to them in their stories, for He fulfilled his promise of letting them see the salvation of Israel before they died. Simeon and Anna lived long lives, plagued by hardship, yet they remained faithful to God, and God rewarded their faithfulness. It is the same for us: if we remain faithful through the hardships in our lives, so God will reward our faithfulness and answer our prayers.

Have Eucharistic Miracles been acknowledged by the Catholic Church?

Revival Eucharistic miracles serve as a testament to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and since they defy natural explanations, the Church employs a rigorous investigation to ensure their authenticity.

Miracles have occurred due to a doubting priest, by irresponsible or accidental mistreatment of a consecrated host, or even a criminal act of mistreatment or sacrilege. On the other hand, some because of an extraordinary devotion to or a great longing for the Eucharist. A significant number take the form of incorruptible flesh and blood. Others result in physical or spiritual healing, raptures and ecstasies, and visions of Jesus. Some of the more famous of these Eucharistic miracles include:

Lanciano: Arguably the most famous Eucharistic miracle is the Miracle of Lanciano in the 8th century. Not only was there a visible transformation of the bread and wine into flesh and blood, but both also remain today as incorruptible and displayed in the Church of St. Francis in Lanciano. Scientific investigation in 1970 concluded that the flesh is muscular tissue of the heart wall, and both flesh and blood are human with blood type AB.

Bolsena: During the 13th century in the town of Bolsena, Italy, a priest who was struggling with doubts about the Eucharist saw blood seeping from the consecrated host during Mass. This miracle led to the institution of the Feast of Corpus Christi by Pope Urban IV in 1264.

Buenos Aires: More recently in 1996, in Buenos Aires, Argentina, a consecrated host took on the appearance of bloody flesh after accidently being dropped on the floor. The results of rigid scientific investigations ordered by Bishop Jorge Bergoglio (now Pope Francis) have confirmed the presence of human blood from the left ventricle of the heart muscle. Samples from this and the 8th century Lanciano miracle (see above) have since determined that both samples came from the same person.

The Catholic Church has recognized some of the Eucharistic miracles throughout history, which are typically considered matters of faith, rather than scientifically confirmed events. It's important to note that perspectives on these events may differ among Catholics. Not all of these events are officially recognized by the Catholic Church.







No registration for the training is required. Bring your friends and neighbors to this important session—what you learn could save someone's life!




