

#### TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

14 January 2024 | Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B

- 1. The songs that we sing in church for our Sunday liturgy are not just chosen at random, but carefully chosen to match the liturgy for that weekend. During these years when we are observing the National Eucharistic Revival, I have asked our choir to lead us in singing a **traditional Eucharistic hymn** right after communion. My favorite among these is "Jesus, My Lord, My God, My All" by Frederick W. Faber (1814 -1863). Singing these songs fosters a sense of continuity with the past. It helps preserve and pass on the beauty of sacred music, contributing to a collective worship experience that transcends generations. These hymns often carry profound theological meanings, thus deepening our understanding of the Eucharist.
- 2. This week you will receive in the mail my letter inviting all parishioners to participate in the **Catholic Ministry Appeal 2024**. This annual appeal is a reminder for us to support the various critical ministries of our diocese that no one single parish could address alone. We have a lower **goal for 2024**: \$59,640, yay! Our goal for 2023 was \$61,085. Out of the 477 total number of families in our parish at the beginning of 2023, 262 families made a pledge (about 55% participation rate). Hopefully this year, we'll have more parishioners supporting CMA. Our commitment weekend is on January 27-28. If you're still unable to make a pledge, please consider making a one-time contribution of \$20 for CMA.
- 3. "What are you looking for?" we hear Jesus asking in today's **gospel** (John 1:35-42). What do you want? In whatever stage of life we may find ourselves right now, it would be good for us to ask ourselves today this question: What is it that I want for the rest of my life? If we ponder on this question long enough, we will realize that we are really looking for love, for peace and happiness. We are looking for meaning. We are really looking for God. Today let us ask for the grace to be open to our Lord's invitation to "Come and see." May we have the generosity to answer his call and to be of service to God and to one another.

With gratitude for your generosity, we exceeded our goal in 2023 of \$61,086! Our parish pledged \$64,681 - 106% of our goal! Our commitment weekend for the 2024 Catholic Ministry Appeal is January 27 & 28. Our goal for 2024 is lower than last year at \$59,640.

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to continue God's work on earth. Taking care of God's poor is one way to live gospel values. This month, through your gifts, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul was able to assist families, providing food, and paying utility, rent, and other bills. **May God Bless you for your continuing support!** 

In December our Visitation Case Workers received **95** phone calls. They served **77** households and made **41** home visits that provided support for **77** individuals. Our volunteers delivered a total of **325 lbs.** of food and distributed **\$5482.87** in support of the needy. They volunteered **252** hours and drove **836** miles in the service to our clients.

Our Food Pantry had **112** Cases that provided support for **309** individuals. Our Food Pantry had **21** volunteers who worked **69** hours stocking shelves and giving out **3050** pounds of food to our clients.

We also gave out 22 \$15.00 Publix gift cards, 2 hams, bread and pastries; as well as numerous toys, socks, children's underwear, T-shirts, gloves, sweatshirts, blankets, mats, candles, and Christmas ornaments, and one blow-up mattress.

We are still trying to recruit volunteers to do home visits or to help with our money and food collections. Next weekend January 20-21, SVdP collects food for the needy.
