




- 1. Since I have been assigned here to St Thomas, many of you have asked me what sign I flash during the **sign of peace**. I do not use the traditional peace sign as many of you do. I use the sign pictured here. Just so you know, it is not a "gang" sign or anything offensive, it is the universal sign language for "I love you." Jesus tells us we need to love one another as I have loved you, and I take that to heart. If only everyone in the world would love as Jesus instructed, we would live in the most peaceful world possible. I suspect that is what heaven is like.
- 2. Our parish is growing so beautifully, more families, more children, and even folks from other faiths. We are a welcoming parish, welcoming everyone no matter where they come from in life. Some of you might even be thinking of converting. We can make that happen. Maybe you are baptized Catholic, and even received Holy Communion, but still need Confirmation to be a sponsor. 
