

January 28, 2024 | Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B


Our parish is in the midst of the Catholic Ministry Appeal (CMA) during the month of January. This weekend, the Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time, is commitment weekend. What is the Catholic Ministry Appeal? The CMA is how the Diocese funds ministries and services that no single parish could fund on its own. Some of these include Catholic charities, vocation promotion, seminarian support, campus ministry efforts, and the Lay Pastoral Ministry Institute. Leadership, administrative, and business costs are NOT funded by your CMA commitment. As a donor, you can also direct your donation to a ministry you wish to support.

I have benefited from the CMA personally, as a graduate of the Lay Pastoral Ministry Institute (LPMI). The LPMI's mission is to prepare the "laity to offer their unique gifts in service to the local church." It is a four-year program that trains the lay person to be an effective minister to their parish and allow their parish to flourish. At our Baptism, we are called to evangelize others, as members of the common priesthood. During the three years of formation, we are trained in leadership skills on a theological, pastoral, and collaborative level. We also go through theological reflection, to help form us for our mission of "God's people doing God's work."

In today's gospel reading (Mark 1:21-28), we hear of the first public appearance of Jesus in the synagogue, the center of Jewish life. The people were astonished, as Jesus taught with authority. An unclean spirit recognized Jesus as the "Holy One of God." The unclean spirit recognized Jesus when others did not. Jesus rebukes the spirit, silences him, and commands him to come out. The people are amazed. They recognize the connection between Jesus' teaching and his power to dispel evil. The teaching itself – the revelation of the good news of God and his plan - will free human beings from their captivity to evil. At this first manifestation of divine authority, Jesus's fame spreads everywhere throughout Galilee.

Today's Gospel states that Jesus "taught as one having authority, and not as the scribes" (Mark 1:22). He proved his authority with accompanying signs, such as casting out a demon. We criticize our leaders for being too weak or the Catholic Church for being too firm. Why can't the Church loosen up her doctrines and "get with the times"? The truth is, the Church cannot "change with the times." Jesus, who "is the same today, yesterday, and forever," founded the Church (Hebrews 13:8). However, together, we can continue to stay strong in the way God is calling us and, through your support of the Catholic Ministry Appeal, spread the Good News as we always have.
