

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

25 February, 2024, Second Sunday in Lent



February 25, 2024 | Second Sunday of Lent, Year B

- 1. Since **cremation** was approved by the Vatican in 1963, it has become popular as an appropriate, perhaps more affordable, way to care for our beloved deceased. Nearly one third of American Catholic families opt for cremation today, and the number continues to grow each year, although Church teaching continues to stress the preference for burial or entombment of the body of the deceased, which is done in imitation of the burial of Jesus' body.
- 2. On December 12, 2023, the Vatican Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith upheld a rule mandating that the ashes of the deceased be preserved in a consecrated place; however, **new guidance** provides that the family members could request a "minimal part of the ashes" to be kept in a sacred place of significance. While there is still a canonical prohibition against scattering the ashes of the deceased, this new guidance allows for family members to retain a small part of their beloved's ashes.
- 3. Our **Gospel** today (Mark 9:2-10) reflects on the transfiguration of Jesus, an event that is recorded in all three of the Synoptic Gospels (Mark 9:2-13; Matthew 17:1-13; Luke 9:28-36), and is also foretold throughout the Old Testament. In the transfiguration, "For a moment Jesus discloses his divine glory" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 555). It provides us with just a glimpse of the glory of Jesus' resurrection: his face shining like the sun, his clothes dazzlingly white, the promise of Easter. The transfiguration is also "the sacrament of the second regeneration": our own Resurrection" (CCC 556). You're not alone if you never thought of the transfiguration as the sacrament of your own resurrection. As we prepare ourselves this Lent for Jesus' resurrection on Easter, let's devote some time in preparing for our own resurrections. There's a simple formula to help us: pray more, fast more, give more.






