

TENDING GOD'S FLOCK

3 March, 2024, Third Sunday in Lent



3 March, 2024 | Third Sunday of Lent, Year B

- 1. I am writing these lines from the Philippines, a few days after I buried **my father**, Virgilio Diaz Sr., who died last January 26th. He was 89 years old when he passed, leaving behind my 88-year old mother, his six children, nine grandchildren, and one great-grandchild. My father fought a lengthy battle with kidney cancer. He spent his final days in severe pain from the chest catheter his doctors had to insert to drain fluids from his lungs. I feel blessed to have spent a couple of days by his bedside, praying with him, helping him to transition peacefully to eternal life. He taught his children the values of thrift, resiliency, and resourcefulness. He was far from perfect, but there's no doubt I love him, warts and all!
- 2. It is difficult to have a sense of relief even when death comes after a long battle with illness. There is a **great mystery** about illness which can be a form of silent witness to weakness, to helplessness, and pain. This is what comes to my mind when I think of my father's painful experience before he finally died. I am reminded of how difficult it was for me to watch St. John Paul II during the last few years of his ministry as pope. Yet he left us with a powerful example of how to live through our sufferings, a silent witness to endurance and commitment.
- 3. We have in today's **Gospel** (John 2:13-25) the "cleansing" of the Jerusalem temple. The people asked Jesus for a sign from heaven as proof that he has authority to overturn the moneychangers' tables and to drive the animals out of the temple area. In reply, Jesus said: "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." There is a connection between the Jerusalem temple and the temple of the body of Jesus. For the Jews, the Jerusalem temple was a sign of God's presence in their midst. But this is now supplanted with the coming of Jesus, in whom a new presence of God is manifested.
