THE FIRST SATURDAY MASS FOR PEACE

Sat, June 7, 9am. When our Blessed Mother appeared at Fatima, she told three children that she was very sad and concerned. She lamented the sin and discord in our families and in our world. To "bring peace to the world," she told us to pray the Rosary; to offer the sacrifice of living each day well, and to make "the First Saturday Communions of reparation." We invite you to come to the First Saturday Mass, followed by the Rosary, and pray with us for peace in our families and in our world.

To complete the FIVE FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTIONS one must offer before each of the following, the intention "in reparation for the offences committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary":

- 1.Receive the Sacrament of Confession within eight days of the First Saturday.
- 2. Receive Holy Communion on each First Saturday (Our Lord told Lucia in 1930, "This Communion will be accepted on the following Sunday for just reasons, if my priests allow it so." If work, school, sickness, or a just reason prevents the Communion on a First Saturday, with this permission it may be received the following Sunday. If Communion is transferred, any or all of the other acts of the devotion may also be performed on Sunday if the person so desires. Attending 5pm Saturday Mass DOES fulfill this.)
- Recite the Rosary offered in reparation to her Immaculate Heart and said properly while meditating.
- 4.Meditate for 15 minutes on one or more mysteries. Our Lady promised to be present when she said "...those who keep me company....". (15 minutes of meditation are in addition to the recitation of the Rosary)

FR HOMIC'S HOMILIES

Today we celebrate our Lord's Ascension into Heaven. Our Gospel reading comes from St. Luke who often incudes interesting details to his account of Jesus' life. After all the intensity of Jesus' Passion and Death, our Lord's Ascension is described in a rather anticlimactic way. His concluding remarks and exit is certainly less dramatic than expected. It doesn't seem at all as the ending of a beautiful story.

And that is, because it is. Jesus' Ascension is not the end of the story, but the closing of the chapter of the much fuller story of God's continuing plan for humanity.

St. Luke tells us more about this event in his accounting in the Acts of the Apostles. There he tells us Jesus' Ascension took place forty days after His Resurrection. And during those days, Jesus had carried on His mission to shepherd His flock. He appeared to strengthen them, to encourage them and to build them up. It was a time for them to explore what their future life would be like. It was a time for personal reflection, prayer and a renewed sense of mission.

St. Luke tells us that before Jesus ascends, He summarized the mission He has been set forth to carry out: Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in His name to all the nations. From there, He led the Apostles out to the city of Bethany, just about 2 miles east of Jerusalem toward the Jordan River.

Bethany had become a comfortable city for Jesus, a sort home away from home. It is the city where His friends Mary, Martha and Lazarus lived and the place He would often stay overnight while visiting Jerusalem. And it was the place He raised Lazarus from the dead.

And it is to this area, on the mount called Olivet, that He ascended. This is the same "Mount of Olivet" where Jesus experienced his "agony in the garden" after the Last Supper. It was the place He was arrested and taken into custody. It was a place where He practiced full surrender to the Father's will in the face of pending doom.

And it is here that He privately instructs His disciples to return to Jerusalem and wait until *you will be clothed with power from on high.* He then raised His hands and blessed them, a gesture of His priestly role, preparing them for what would come next.

He was then *taken up to Heaven*. It was a close to the chapter, but not to the story. Jesus returned home to His Father as a *completion* of His mission to atone for our sins. So, not only His Passion, Death and Resurrection, but also His Ascension is the conclusion of the entire sacrifice of atonement, as specified in Leviticus 16. Jesus' Ascension into the heavenly sanctuary fulfills his Paschal Sacrifice in atonement for our sins... chapter closed, a new one opens.

As the Apostles watched Jesus disappear among the clouds, they returned to Jerusalem with great joy praising God and anticipating the promise of the Father, to send the Holy Spirit upon them.

And that is where we leave today's homily, awaiting the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost we celebrate next week. May God bless you abundantly this week.


