FR HOMIC'S HOMILIES

Last week the Gospel reported the seemingly anticlimactic exit of our Lord as He ascended into Heaven. His exit was almost nondescript, because there was so much more to come. He quietly ascended, but He knew how powerfully He would instill His Presence to each of His Apostles.

He ascended with the parting words that He would be sending the promise of My Father upon you... and you will be clothed with power from on high. (Lk 24:49) They returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God. (Lk 24:53) All devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus. (Acts 1:14)

Those scriptural details are not just side notes but are important to understand what prepared the Apostles to receive such a gift. They spent those nine days in humble prayer, praising and thanking God, emptying themselves of any self-reliance, surrendering in complete trust into the Father's hands saturated in love and mercy. Today's Gospel picks up the story from there as we learn how that *promise of the Father* was fulfilled.

The Acts of the Apostles report of the spectacular descending of the Holy Spirit. The Apostles were gathered *in one place together.* Suddenly, there was a thunderous noise like a strong wind, like a tornado, came from the sky. To their surprise, tongues as of fire appeared *which parted and came to rest on each one of them.*

As stunning as that must have been, something even more spectacular happens. The tongues as of fire began to spark something *inside* each person's soul. Their motivation, their desire, their love, began to magnify. They became unified and were in harmony with the heart and mind of Jesus.

The Wisdom of God descended upon them and penetrated their souls that had been prepared by the intensity of their desire for this gift. Transformed, they were no longer operating as outsiders looking in, but as people who possessed this wisdom, knowledge and understanding.

The Holy Spirit united them to the mind and heart of Jesus, for the Holy Spirit is God's Spirit. His burning love for His Father and merciful love for humanity permeated their interior. They put on the mind of Christ, which is in complete union with the mind of the Father. His love filled their hearts and that animated their words. The Apostles spoke of the mercy of God, which radiated God's love for them, and Scripture tells us 3,000 were converted to the faith that day.

God's mercy and love is the universal language that every person longs to hear. It is the language that speaks to each person's heart. We long to be loved and we long to love, and God offers us that pure kind of love.

Regardless of the human flaws in each of the Apostles, Jesus remained with them and strengthened them even when they fell. No matter the stumble, whether natural fault or human weakness, Jesus remained steadfast to encourage them to find their footing and persevere. He taught them to cling to Him in love and to walk forward in faith.

God's movement in our life is often less dramatic than the Apostles' experience. It is most often gentle, and hardly perceptible at all. It is more like a gentle breeze instead of the mighty winds. It is a whisper in the quiet reflective times in our life. It is a prompting to pause and pray. It is an inspiration to forgive when we want revenge, or to love the unlovable.

Let's make a point of sitting in quiet focus, listen for His inspiration, surrendering over to Him, and open to receive. Let the flame of the Holy Spirit ignite His love within our soul. And let us be unified in complete harmony with the heart and mind of Jesus. May God bless you abundantly this week.




