Pastor's Report

- Capital campaign is going well, getting close to 15% of goal
- Hoping to reach 800 families by June, have volunteers and need more, the more the merrier!

Administrative Report

- Endowment Fund Grant requests are due by April 7th

Finance Council

- Mark K. from facilities presented the needs and expected costs, along with timelines and priorities
- School received some employer matches. Note that sometimes they'll match for a school but not a church. The parish office can help with paperwork and answer questions.

Latino Council

- Hosted a dinner last Saturday 2/15 "With God and by your hand" with a good turn out of 60 couples. A couple gave testimony and Fr. Scott spoke. It was a success with lots of positive feedback.

Faith Formation Council

 Totus Tuus June 22-27: need adult volunteers, no training required just need chaperones, grades 1-6 in the mornings (need 8 adults) and 7-12 in the evenings with dinner served (need 1 adult). There is space for 90 kids and 60 tween/teens. Advertisements have started.

- OCIA: new structure has been working well, but isn't feasible with the large number of candidates, so will be transitioning to offering 2 sessions each week and participants can choose one to attend. Coordinator of adult formation, Lucas L., is tailoring the curriculum to the parish based on what he's learned so far.
- Youth ministry: need more volunteers for the June 7th Latino ministry retreat, English speakers are welcome to volunteer to lead small groups.

Social Justice Council.

- Course "This Land is Not Our Own" Mondays for 8 weeks on Zoom
- Newest ministry is for youth empowerment 9 students have completed the program which addresses topics such as the MN Promise program and how to fill out education planning paperwork

Stewardship Council

- Ways to build community: consider name tags at Mass, name tags at all MAC events
- Parish census have heard about difficulties reaching people, could be done at Mass or at another time, interested in helping improve data accuracy for parishioners contact information

V. Endowment Fund Grants

- Applications due to Rick Storms on Monday April 7
- Available Funds:
 - Pastoral Care \$8496
 - Undesignated \$75,000
 Any MAC can apply for grants from this fund, individually or in collaboration with other councils
- Ideas under discussion:
 - Possible Community Garden expansion?
 - Cross MAC projects with CLC and/or SJC?
 - Donation bin liner cleaning or replacement?
- Remaining 2024-25 Funds:
 - Most of \$1000 grant for Preschool Garden program remaining
 - Purchase seeds, compostable pots?
 - Use for plants and soil amendments?
 - Courtyard Coffeemaker Status
 - Listed as a grant for \$8000 to PCC for 2024-25

Followup from Karen after PLC meeting:

- Garden -
 - I told Rick we would need about \$500 for the garden expenses. He said he would cover expenses this year but we need to think about how to cover it in the future.
- Courtyard Coffee Maker Nothing has been purchased according to Rick. Toward the end of April he
 will convene a committee to select the best alternative.
- Donation Bins cleaning or replacement -Rick said bin replacement could be considered as an endowment project
 because of the age of the bins. Or if we wanted to buy equipment to clean
 the bins that could also be under the endowment funds.
- Cross MAC projects.
 - Possible to do another project with Community Life. Example would be another Lent or Advent project under a different name. I could check with Anne to see what projects they might have in mind and if they would need money for it.
 - PCC could work with Social Justice to help pay for passports or licenses. This would fit under the endowment rules according to Rick. Beth Aune at PLC said Phil Aune has some ideas.
