Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.

YOU'RE NOT DONE YET

This is not just another Sunday. This is a Sunday of joy, of gratitude, of resurrection power! As the streets of New Orleans quiet down from the rhythm of Jazz Fest, we gather here with hearts tuned to the rhythm of Heaven. Jazz, like life, rises from the soul. Born in pain, refined through struggle, but it lives, moves, and lifts. And so too does our faith — especially in the Easter season.

Our Gospel today gives us a tender and powerful scene: Peter, broken by the memory of his denial, returns to the sea. He goes back to what is familiar. Isn't that us sometimes? After failure, after sin, after weariness — we go back. Back to hiding, back to old habits. But Jesus meets Peter right there. On the shore of shame, He brings a miracle and makes breakfast. No judgment. Just love.

Then comes that haunting, healing question: "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Not once, but three times. Once for every denial. Jesus doesn't shame Peter; He restores him. This is not punishment. This is healing. This is grace. And He says, "Feed my sheep." Friend, we're not our mistake. We are not our past. In Christ, we are your mission.

In the First Reading, the apostles who once fled in fear now stand boldly before the high council. "We must obey God rather than men!" they proclaim. That's not just courage; that's transformation! That's resurrection power flowing through human weakness. When you meet the risen Jesus, your shame becomes your testimony, your past becomes your pulpit.

And in the majestic scene from Revelation, the heavens explode with worship: "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain! "There is no more hiding. No more fear. The universe sings. Why? Because love has won. Christ is alive. And the Lamb who was slain is the King who reigns.

And right here in this church — we honor the quiet heroes who, like Peter, said "Yes" to the call: our volunteers. You who sweep the floors, teach our children, hand out bulletins, play instruments, sing, lead ministries, decorate altars, serve at the altar, organize food, make coffee, visit the sick, money counters, those working behind the scenes ...etc... You are not just helpers. You are the hands of Christ. You feed His sheep.

Maybe you think no one sees. But Heaven sees. Thank you. Thank you. THANK YOU. Your faithfulness is holy. Your service is sacred. You are part of the Resurrection story.

So Church, here's the message: Rise — from the ashes of failure. Because our God is a God of second chances. Rejoice — because your name is written in the Book of Life. And joy always comes in the morning. Repeat — this rhythm of love. Like jazz, keep playing. Keep serving. Keep trusting. Keep singing. Because you are not finished. You are just getting started. There is fire in your bones. There is purpose in your pain. There is victory in your voice. Let the song of your life rise with the saints, echo through the pews, and shake the gates of hell. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! And so are you... *From Pastor's Desk... Fr. Freddie*

How Is a New Pope Selected?

With the recent passing of Pope Francis, the Catholic Church embarks on the sacred process of choosing a new shepherd. This journey, steeped in tradition and guided by the Holy Spirit, unfolds through the Papal Conclave.

The Conclave: A Sacred Assembly

- **Who Participates?** The College of Cardinals, comprising cardinals under the age of 80, gathers in Vatican City. These cardinal electors are entrusted with the responsibility of electing the new pope.

Seclusion for Discernment The term *conclave* comes from the Latin *cum clave*, meaning "with a key." The cardinals are secluded within the Sistine Chapel, ensuring a prayerful and confidential environment for discernment.

The Voting Process

- **Daily Ballots** Up to four ballots are conducted each day—two in the morning and two in the afternoon. A two-thirds majority is required for a candidate to be elected pope.

- **Smoke Signals** After each voting session, the ballots are burned. The color of the smoke signals the outcome:

- o **Black Smoke:** No decision yet.

- o **White Smoke:** A new pope has been elected!

The Announcement: "Habemus Papam!"

Once a cardinal accepts the election and chooses a papal name, the senior cardinal deacon announces to the world:

"Habemus Papam!" ("We have a pope!")

The new pope then appears on the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica to impart his first blessing.

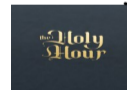

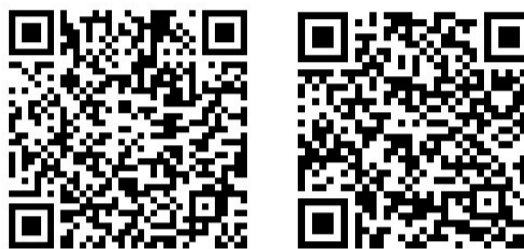
REFLECTION
Third Sunday of Easter

It is not a surprise to see Peter out on the sea fishing. He was, after all, a fisherman. Without Jesus to lead him, Peter returns to his old vocation. It is also unsurprising to see him fishing at night. From the middle of the sea, he won't be able to hear the rooster crowing at dawn, that daily reminder of his betrayal on that fateful morning. Finally, it was inevitable that their labor produce nothing; the same thing happened before they encountered Jesus the first time. Symbolically, the contrast between their catch without Jesus (zero) and with Jesus (one hundred fifty-three, thought to represent all the known species) cannot be starker. At last, Peter realizes that his true vocation is to "catch" disciples from every place on earth.
