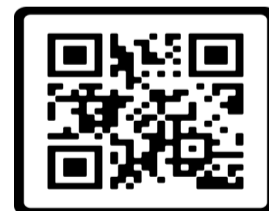

Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.

This is the Day the Lord has Made.

Today we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord—a mystery not of absence, but of mission. Jesus returns to the Father, but not before entrusting His Church with a divine task: “Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature.” He does not leave us behind—He lifts us up to share in His saving work.

This solemnity is also deeply personal for me, as I celebrate five years since my priestly ordination on May 23, 2020. On that day, I had dreamed of celebrating that milestone with over a thousand people. More than 800 had already responded parishioners and friends from my years of formation in Washington, D.C., Alexandria (VA), Baltimore, Alabama, and New Orleans. The Ugandan Catholic community in D.C. had prepared the liturgy, practiced the music, and planned a joyful reception with traditional food and attire. My mother, siblings, and friends were to travel from Uganda, Canada, the UK, and beyond.

But none of it happened. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, only eight people were allowed to be present at my ordination. The grand celebration became a quiet livestream. Yet even then, God was not absent. He was there—faithful and true—as He always is. That humble ordination reminded me that the priesthood is not about crowds or applause, but about service, surrender, and sacrificial love.

These five years have been sustained by grace, and by people whose lives reflect God's love. Fr. David, a main celebrant on my 5th priestly anniversary, was my classmate at the Dominican House of Studies-University. I was the only Black student in my class and university, bringing with me a different cultural experience, having just arrived from Africa for graduate studies. Fr. David walked beside me, helping me adjust to a new academic system and culture. I later transferred to Catholic University, completed my studies quickly, and was ordained three months before him—but our brotherhood has endured. We shared meals, visited each other's families, and supported each other in ministry.

Fr. Frank, today's homilist for my 5th priestly anniversary, is a retired Paulist priest now based in New York. He was a mentor to me both in seminary and after ordination. His support was both spiritual and practical. Once, a Saudi PhD student in mechanical engineering at Catholic University lacked transportation. I asked him if he knew someone who might donate a car. Without hesitation, he gave her one. That, to me, is the Gospel in action. He also taught me how to play golf—and even bought me my first set of clubs.

Every parish and place I've lived; I've tried to make into a home. My first priestly assignment was at Corpus Christi–Epiphany Church in New Orleans. After one year, I was entrusted with the pastoral leadership of All Saints Church, where I now serve. From every former parish to where I am today, I can truly say: it takes a village to raise a child—and it has taken many faithful people to raise, form, and walk with me.

The Ascension of Christ calls us not just to look up—but to go out. Jesus lifts us so that we can lift others. As I reflect on five years of priesthood, I do not celebrate what I have done—I celebrate what Christ has done through me, through us, and through His Church. He is still sending us. He is still with us. And He still says to each one of us: “Go and proclaim.”

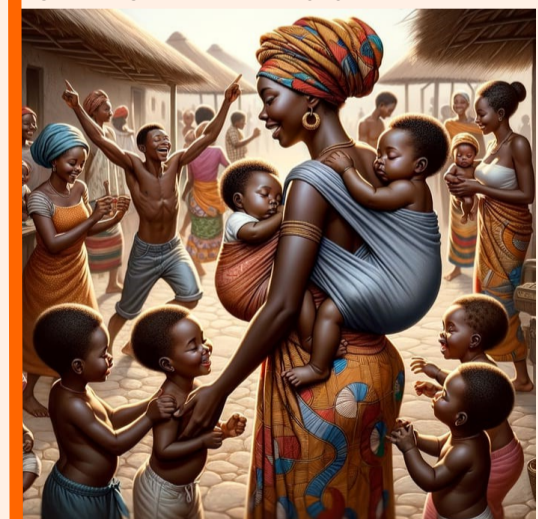
