Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.

The Answer Is Already in Your Heart!

Beloved in Christ, what if I told you that the breakthrough you're searching for the peace, the healing, the strength, the sense of purpose is already planted within you?

In our first reading today, Moses pleads with a weary, wandering people: "The command I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious or remote... It is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts." What a profound truth! God is not hiding from you. His word, His healing, His love, they're already closer than your next breath.

But life often makes us forget that. Trauma, poverty, betrayal, burnout, depression, they whisper lies to us: "You're not enough. You'll never make it. No one cares." But hear this: God's voice is louder. And His voice says: You are my beloved. You are capable. You are never alone.

Psychology teaches that healing begins when we are seen, when our pain is acknowledged, and when we believe we are worthy of love. That's what the Good Samaritan did. He saw the wounded man. He stopped. He touched his pain. He poured oil and wine, symbols of healing and Eucharistic grace, over his wounds. He did not ask the victim's background, politics, or religion. He simply saw his humanity.

Who in your life needs that kind of mercy? Maybe you are the one lying half-dead, exhausted from the robbers of shame, fear, and rejection. But listen: God has not passed you by. Christ, the true Samaritan, stops for you. And He pours Himself out through the Cross, through the Eucharist, through your neighbor who still believes in you.

Jesus says today: "Go and do likewise." This is your invitation to become a healer, to speak life, to start again. And don't say, "It's too hard." Moses already answered that: "It is not across the sea... it is already in your heart."

So, Church, turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live! That's not a slogan, it's a promise. In Christ, you are not stuck. You are becoming. You are rising. You are healing.

Let us then rise up today emotionally, spiritually, financially, physically and become instruments of mercy and prosperity in a world starved for hope. Love is your command. Mercy is your power. And the Spirit of God is your strength.
