What does it mean to be Catholic?

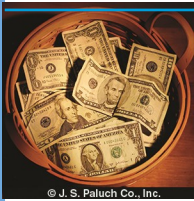
Each Catholic is called to full and active participation in the life of the Church and has the right and responsibility to:

Pastor's Reflection

Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.

From Suffering to Victory, From Death to Life: Lifted Up in Love.

Today we lift high the Cross, not as a sign of defeat, but as the ultimate sign of God's love and victory. The readings draw us into the mystery of salvation how suffering, when united to God, becomes the very doorway to life.

In the first reading from Numbers, the people grew weary in the desert. Frustration, hunger, and fear led them to complain against God. Then came the serpents, a painful reminder of their sin. But when Moses lifted the bronze serpent on a pole, those who looked upon it with faith were healed. That serpent, lifted high, pointed forward to the true remedy for sin Jesus Christ lifted on the Cross.

Saint Paul, in the Letter to the Philippians, reveals the heart of the Cross. Jesus, though He was God, humbled Himself, taking the form of a servant. He became obedient unto death, death on a Cross. But the story does not end with death. Because of His humility, because of His obedience, God exalted Him so that at His name every knee should bow, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord. The Cross, once an instrument of shame, is now the throne of victory.

And in the Gospel of John, we hear the verse that has changed the world: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." The Cross is not a symbol of condemnation, it is the symbol of God's mercy. Jesus was lifted up not to crush us, but to lift us with Him into eternal life.

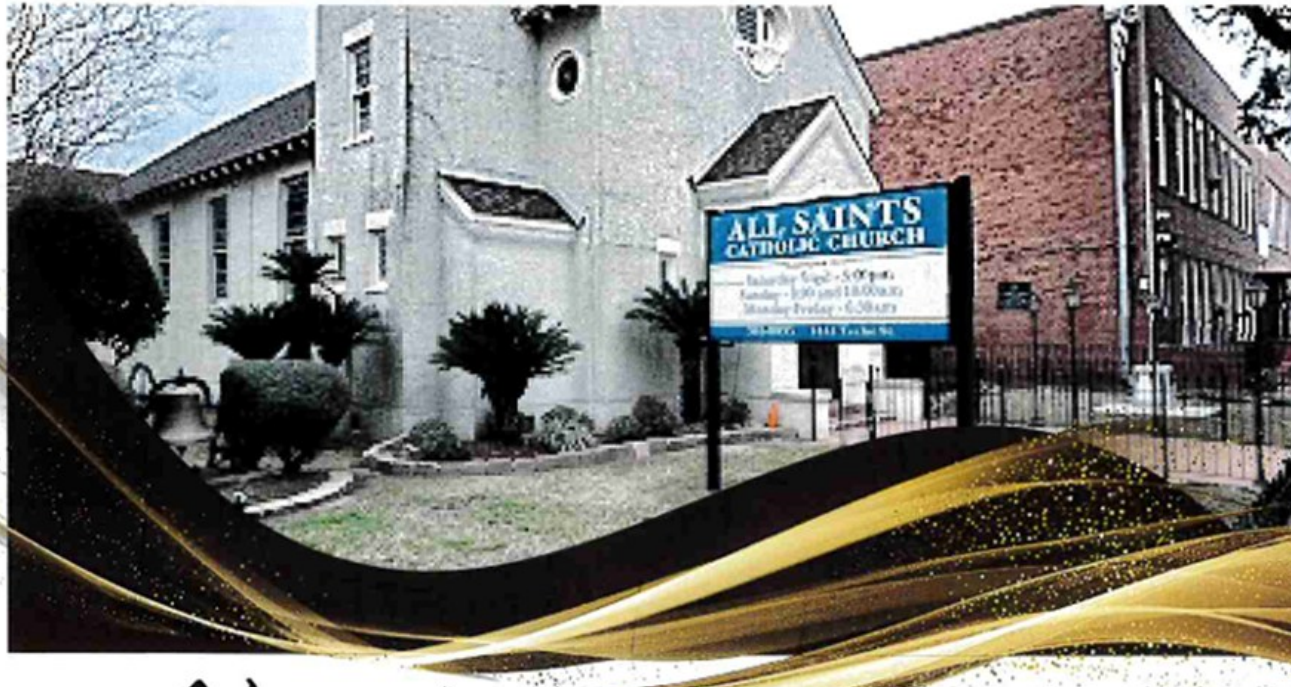
So what does this mean for us today? The Cross teaches us two powerful truths: The depth of God's love. Whenever you doubt your worth, whenever life feels heavy, look at the Cross. There you see how far God was willing to go for you. He gave His only Son not for the righteous, but for sinners. Not for the perfect, but for the broken.

The power of surrender. Like the Israelites in the desert, we often grow weary and complain. We face our own serpents fear, doubt, sin, and suffering. But healing begins when we lift our eyes to the Cross, when we surrender our pain and let Christ's love transform it.

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross reminds us: what the world sees as weakness, God transforms into strength. What looks like death, God turns into life. The Cross is not the end it is the beginning of hope, the sign that love is stronger than sin, stronger than suffering, stronger even than death.

So let us not be ashamed of the Cross. Let us exalt it, honor it, and carry our own crosses with faith, knowing that through them, God is drawing us into the victory of His Son.

And let us never forget: For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son... That means God so loved you. We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your Cross you have redeemed the world. *From Pastor's Desk...Fr. Freddie*

Special Announcement: Launching a \$3.5 Million Capital Campaign

We are beginning a seven-year campaign dedicated to addressing the following urgent needs:

Rectory Foundation Repairs

The rectory is unstable and sinking. Repairs are needed to make it safe for habitation and preservation of the structure.

Church Exterior Restoration

Restoration-repainting is vital for preservation and for honoring the sacredness of the space.

Landscaping and Drainage

Our walkways are cracked, buckled and unsafe.

Security and safety Enhancements

A sturdy secure fence around the church's perimeter and upgraded surveillance and lighting are critical.

Technology, Musical and Communication System Upgrade

These funds will support the purchase of a replacement music organ (as the current one is broken beyond repair), and an upgrade to the sound system to include installation of new choir microphones, and livestreaming improvement.

Pastoral Hall Building

The Althea Holmes Pastoral Center is the heart of our parish's social and spiritual life. It hosts parish meetings, fellowship gatherings, youth programs, bereavement repasts, and many other vital activities. During church repairs it served as our church building.

However, the current space is too small. By joining the two existing buildings, we can create a larger, more functional space to better serve our community. We are grateful to the Archdiocese for the upcoming repairs following Hurricane Ida, and once those are complete, we hope to move forward with the building project.

Americans with Disability Act (ADA) Enhancements

Portions of our campus are inaccessible to individuals with mobility challenges. Modifications to all our facilities including the Pastoral Hall Building and second floor of the school building. These upgrades make our Parish more welcoming and inclusive.

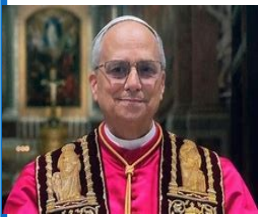
FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS
