5. Help to provide for the needs of the Church.

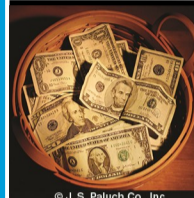

**Pastor's Reflection**

**Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.**

**A Family Rooted in Christ, Living for Him**

Today, our hearts overflow with gratitude as we gather to celebrate Family Day and 106 years of God's blessings upon our beloved All Saints Catholic Church. This is more than a celebration of years; it is a celebration of family, a family built not by blood, but by baptism. As St. Paul reminds us in Romans 6:3-9, we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death, so that we might also live in newness of life.

That is what binds us together, the life of Christ flowing through us. In this church, we are more than members; we are brothers and sisters, mothers and fathers in faith. Some have been here for decades, others only for months, yet all of us share one story: we belong to Jesus, who died for us, and now we are called to live for Him.

Our 2025 theme, "Jesus died for us, let us live for Him," is not just a slogan, it's a mission. In this church, no one is turned away, because Jesus Himself never turns anyone away. This is a house where all are welcome, where the love of Christ unites generations and hearts.

We also remember with love our church family members who have passed away between October 31 2024 and November 1, 2025. Several of them would have dearly desired to be here with us today, worshiping, rejoicing, and celebrating this Family Day together. Though they are no longer with us in body, they remain with us in spirit, united with us in the love and peace of Christ.

As we also honor All Souls' Day, we remember our brothers and sisters who have gone before us. The Book of Wisdom assures us that "the souls of the just are in the hand of God." Those who built this parish, prayed in these pews, and walked before us are still part of our family, now living in the light of God's eternal love. Their faith is the foundation on which we stand today.

And so, dear family of All Saints, as we celebrate this beautiful day, let us recommit ourselves to live for Christ to be a church where love, mercy, and faith are visible every day. Let us carry forward the legacy of 106 years with renewed purpose, remembering always that Jesus died for us... and now, we must live for Him.

## NOVEMBER IS BLACK CATHOLIC HISTORY MONTH

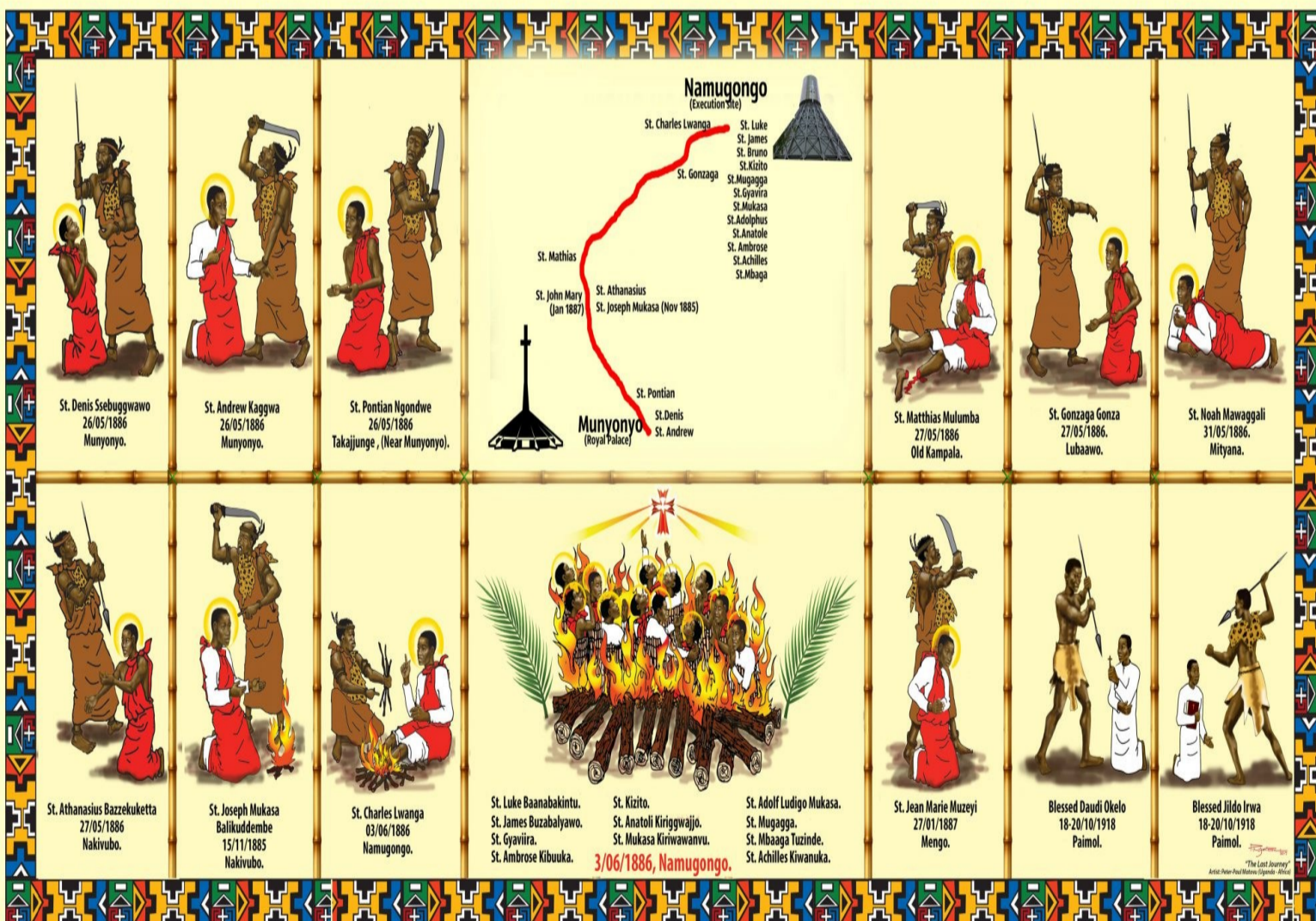
### The Uganda Martyrs

The Uganda Martyrs were a group of 45 Christian converts—22 Catholic and 23 Anglican—who were executed in the Kingdom of Buganda (present-day Uganda) between January 31, 1885, and January 27, 1887.

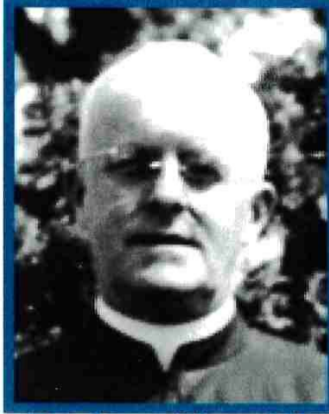
Their deaths were ordered by Mwanga II, the Kabaka (King) of Buganda, during a period marked by intense religious and political conflict at the royal court. At the time, Catholic, Anglican, and Islamic factions were vying for influence over the kingdom's leadership.

This tragic episode unfolded amid the broader context of the Scramble for Africa—the late-19th-century invasion, occupation, and division of African territories by European colonial powers. In the years that followed, the English Church Missionary Society invoked the martyrs' deaths to rally public support for the British acquisition of Uganda as part of the British Empire.

The Catholic Church beatified the 22 Catholic martyrs in 1920 and canonized them in 1964 under Pope Paul VI at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. In 2024, the remains of two of these martyrs, St. Charles Lwanga and St. Mathias Mulumba, were returned to Uganda, marking a significant moment of national and spiritual remembrance.
