Pastor's Reflection

Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.

YOU ARE BELOVED — LIVE FROM YOUR BAPTISM

Readings: Isaiah 40:1-5,9-11; Psalm 104; Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7; Luke 3:15-16,21-22

Today the Jordan River becomes a doorway. Jesus steps into the waters, and heaven opens. The Baptism of the Lord is not only about what happened to Jesus; it is about what God wants to happen to us: that we live as beloved children, filled with the Spirit, and ready to walk in God's will.

In Isaiah we hear: "Comfort, give comfort to my people." God speaks to tired hearts. He promises to straighten what is crooked and to carry His lambs in His arms. That means your weakness is not a reason for despair. God comes to gather, guide, and heal. He is a Shepherd who does not abandon His flock.

Psalm 104 praises the Lord who sends forth His Spirit and renews the face of the earth. If the Spirit can renew creation, He can renew your mind, your marriage, your joy, your courage. God can give fresh breath to what feels dry in your life. The Spirit is not only for saints; He is for every believer.

Saint Paul tells us that God saved us by the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. Baptism is not a photograph from the past; it is a living grace. It trains us to reject what destroys us and to live with self-control and devotion. When God is first, our choices change, and our hearts become strong.

In the Gospel, John points away from himself and toward Jesus: the Mighty One is coming. Then Jesus is baptized and the Father speaks: "You are my beloved Son." This is the heart of today's feast. God calls you beloved before you are perfect. His love is not a reward; it is the beginning of healing.

Many people live trying to earn love and prove their worth, but today God gives us identity. Live from your baptism. When temptation comes, remember: I am God's child. When discouragement comes, remember: the Spirit is with me. Your identity is stronger than your struggle.

Our parish theme calls us to live this truth daily: "Remember to always keep God First." When God is first, the Father's voice becomes louder than every voice of shame, and we begin to live as beloved and sent.

This gathering comes at an important time for the Church in New Orleans and offers men an opportunity to come together, be strengthened in faith, and move forward with hope in what God is preparing.

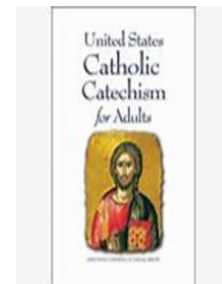

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)

OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is the Church’s process for preparing adults (and older teens) who are not yet Catholic—or who have not completed their sacraments—to become fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

OCIA is for those who are:

- not baptized,
- baptized in another Christian tradition, or
- baptized Catholic but have not received First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation.



Through OCIA, participants learn the Catholic faith and prepare to receive the sacraments of Baptism (if needed), First Holy Communion, and Confirmation.

Our parish OCIA program is a meaningful sign of evangelization—people are responding to Christ and seeking a deeper relationship with Him through the Church. We warmly welcome anyone interested in becoming Catholic or simply learning more about the Catholic faith. Every inquiry is a reminder that God continues to draw hearts toward deeper faith and sacramental life.

REFLECTION

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

“Here is my servant,” the LORD says through Isaiah of a chosen one, a Messiah, a Christ, who would bring justice and healing to the nations (Isaiah 42:1). Isaiah writes again and again in these chapters of the Messiah as a servant, someone who would act at God’s behest in the world. In this way, Isaiah foresees the character of the Messiah. The Messiah would serve God’s will. Therefore, when Jesus insists on John baptizing him, he says it is “to fulfill all righteousness” (Matthew 3:15). Righteousness is moral conduct in accordance with God’s will. Jesus was sent by the Father to save humankind. This is the service he was called to do and, in turn, the service Jesus now calls us to do.
