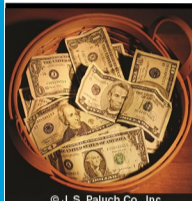

### **Pastor's Reflection**

**Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.**

#### **Let Your Light Shine**

Today's readings carry a powerful and challenging message: God calls us to become light in a world that often feels dark. Not a hidden light or a silent light, but one that shines through love, mercy, and real action.

In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah, the Lord speaks clearly: "Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked... then your light shall break forth like the dawn."

God reminds His people that faith cannot remain only in prayers or rituals. True worship is shown in compassion. Holiness is not simply avoiding sin—it is actively doing good. When we feed the hungry, care for the suffering, and stand with those in need, something extraordinary happens: our light begins to rise in the darkness. This is why the Psalm responds: "The just man is a light in darkness to the upright."

A just person is not someone who is perfect, but someone whose heart is rooted in God. Even when surrounded by fear, hardship, or uncertainty, the righteous shine because they trust the Lord and live generously. Their light does not come from wealth or power, but from grace.

Then Saint Paul, in the second reading, gives us a humbling insight. He says he did not preach with fancy wisdom or persuasive speech. Instead, he preached Christ crucified—simple, powerful, and full of Spirit. Paul reminds us that the strength of the Gospel does not depend on human greatness, but on the power of God working through humble hearts.

This leads beautifully to the Gospel, where Jesus declares: "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world." These words are not a compliment—they are a mission. Jesus does not say, "Try to become light someday." He says, "You are light." By baptism, we carry Christ within us. And light has only one purpose: to shine.

Jesus warns us not to hide the lamp under a basket. In other words, our faith is not meant to be private or inactive. The world needs disciples who will brighten places of darkness in families, workplaces, communities, and parishes.

And how does our light shine? Through kindness, generosity, forgiveness, and service. When others see our good deeds, they glorify our Heavenly Father. May we live as true salt and light, letting Christ shine through us always.

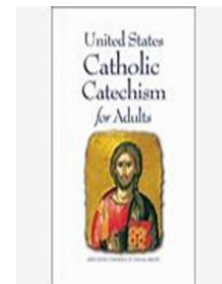


### OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)

OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is the Church’s process for preparing adults (and older teens) who are not yet Catholic—or who have not completed their sacraments—to become fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

OCIA is for those who are:

- not baptized,
- baptized in another Christian tradition, or
- baptized Catholic but have not received First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation.



Through OCIA, participants learn the Catholic faith and prepare to receive the sacraments of Baptism (if needed), First Holy Communion, and Confirmation.

Our parish OCIA program is a meaningful sign of evangelization—people are responding to Christ and seeking a deeper relationship with Him through the Church. We warmly welcome anyone interested in becoming Catholic or simply learning more about the Catholic faith. Every inquiry is a reminder that God continues to draw hearts toward deeper faith and sacramental life.

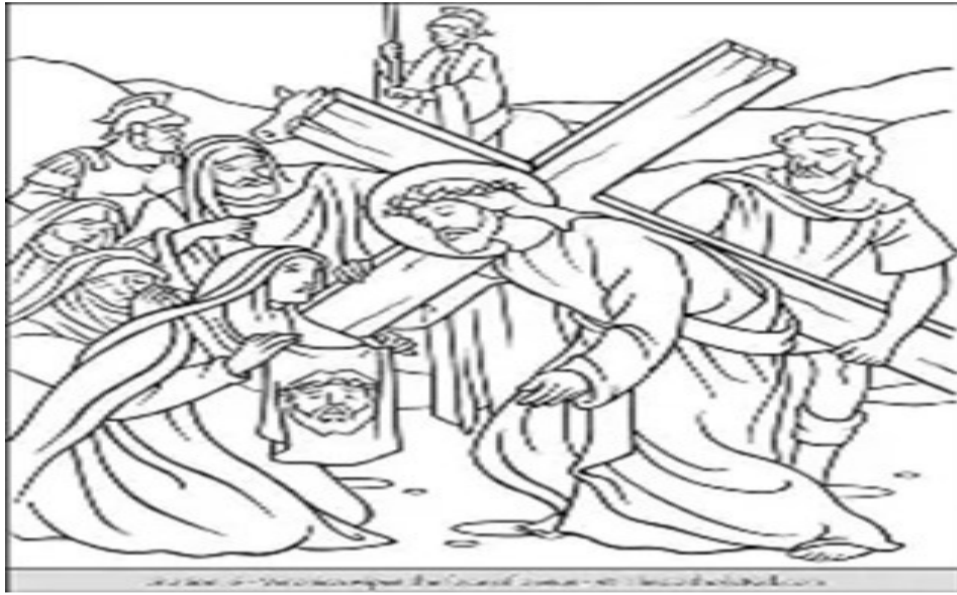

## HOW TO CONTROL CHOLESTEROL

### ✓ UNDERSTAND CHOLESTEROL

Cholesterol is a fat-like substance that comes from two sources: **FOOD** and your **BODY**.

It is only found in foods from animal sources. It travels in the body by lipoproteins (LDL and HDL)

High cholesterol can affect your heart and brain health. It can lead to heart disease and increase the risk of some types of dementia, like Alzheimer's disease.



#### HDL = GOOD

High-density lipoprotein is known as "good" cholesterol.



#### LDL = BAD

Low-density lipoprotein is known as "bad" cholesterol.

HDL helps keep LDL from sticking to artery walls. This reduces plaque buildup and lowers the risk of heart disease and stroke.

### TIPS FOR SUCCESS



#### EAT SMART

Eat meals with lots of vegetables, fruits, whole grains, beans, nuts, and lean proteins like fish and seafood. Limit sugary foods and drinks, red meats, processed meats, salty snacks, and foods that are highly processed.



#### MOVE MORE

Exercise can help lower cholesterol numbers. It can also improve your mood and clear your mind.



#### KNOW YOUR FATS

The fats you eat can affect your cholesterol numbers. Replace saturated fats like butter and whole dairy products with healthy fats. Healthy fats include olive oil, fatty fish, nuts and eggs.



#### NO NICOTINE

Smoking lowers good HDL cholesterol. It also increases your risk of heart disease and affects your brain health.



#### TAKE MEDICATION AS DIRECTED

Taking your medicine is important. Medicines like statins, or others, can help you control your cholesterol numbers.

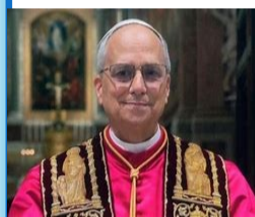
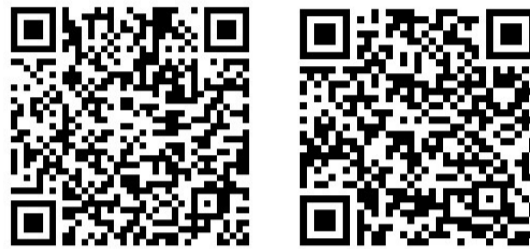
**REFLECTION**  
**FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Later in Matthew’s Gospel, when Jesus speaks to his disciples about the last judgment, his words sound very much like Isaiah’s do today. In both cases, we are told to share what we have with those in need. In fact, both Isaiah and Jesus specifically mention feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. However, Jesus adds another dimension. Jesus teaches us that when we do so, we’re not just doing it for that person in need, we are doing it for him. He challenges us to see him in the person in need. In responding to their need, Isaiah tells us, our light will overcome the darkness. That light will also illuminate the face of Jesus in the person whose need we are satisfying.
