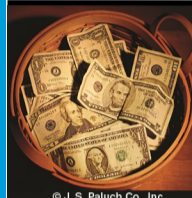

REFLECTIONS

Dear Sisters, Brothers, and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings to you all, and praise the Lord.

Walking as Children of Light

On this 4th Sunday of Lent, often called Laetare Sunday, the Church invites rejoicing because the light of Christ is drawing nearer as Easter approaches.

The first reading from 1 Samuel (16:1–13) tells of David's anointing as king. Samuel is sent to Jesse's house, and he assumes the eldest sons must be chosen. Yet God teaches an important lesson: "The Lord looks not as man looks... man sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart." David, the youngest and least expected, is chosen. This reminds that God's ways are different from human judgment, and He calls those who are humble and faithful.

The second reading from Ephesians (5:8–14) speaks of transformation. St. Paul reminds believers that once they were in darkness, but now they are light in the Lord. The call is clear: live as children of light. Goodness, righteousness, and truth are the fruits that come from walking with Christ.

The Gospel (John 9:1–41) presents the healing of the man born blind. Jesus restores his sight, showing that He is the light of the world. This miracle is not only physical but spiritual. The man begins to see more clearly who Jesus is, while the Pharisees, though physically able to see, remain spiritually blind because of pride and hardness of heart.

This Gospel challenges every heart: spiritual blindness can come through sin, stubbornness, or refusal to accept God's truth. Christ desires to open eyes, not only to see outward reality but to recognize His presence and grace.

Lent is a season of enlightenment. Through prayer, repentance, and humility, Christ leads from darkness into light. The closer Easter comes, the more joyful the journey becomes, because Christ is already working transformation within His people.

May this Sunday strengthen faith and remove all blindness, so that life may reflect the light of Christ in every word and action.

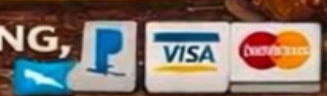

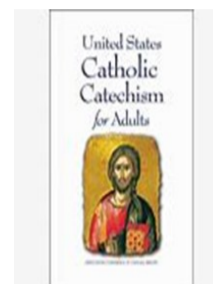


OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)

OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is the Church’s process for preparing adults (and older teens) who are not yet Catholic—or who have not completed their sacraments—to become fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

OCIA is for those who are:

- not baptized,
- baptized in another Christian tradition, or
- baptized Catholic but have not received First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation.



Through OCIA, participants learn the Catholic faith and prepare to receive the sacraments of Baptism (if needed), First Holy Communion, and Confirmation.

Our parish OCIA program is a meaningful sign of evangelization—people are responding to Christ and seeking a deeper relationship with Him through the Church. We warmly welcome anyone interested in becoming Catholic or simply learning more about the Catholic faith. Every inquiry is a reminder that God continues to draw hearts toward deeper faith and sacramental life.

A Call to Prayer & Reflection.

Like Simon of Cyrene, we are called to walk with Jesus and share in His suffering. This Lenten observance fulfills one of the three pillars of Lent: PRAYER.

All are encouraged to attend and take part in this powerful spiritual journey.
Each Stations of the Cross service will be followed by the Reception of the Eucharist.

Guidelines for Fasting and Abstinence!

The following is provided for parishes to publish in their bulletin to assist parishioners in the Lenten practices.

During the season of Lent, the Church urges the faithful to reflect a spirit of penance in their daily lives through performing acts of fast and abstinence and unite themselves to Christ and one another in prayer and voluntary sacrifice so that we might prepare ourselves to rejoice fully in the joy of the Resurrection.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on the evening of Holy Thursday. Abstinence -- Abstinence forbids the eating of meat or poultry. Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday (February 18) and on all Fridays of Lent. This obligation does not prohibit the eating of eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Fasting -- Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday (February 18) and Good Friday (April 3) are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed.

Easter Duty—Catholics who have been admitted to the Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist are obliged to receive Holy Communion and Confession at least once a year between the First Sunday of Lent (February 18) and Holy Trinity Sunday (May 26). Three Wednesdays in Lent (March 11, March 18, and March 25) have been designated as the Archdiocesan “Nights for Confession.” On these dates, the Sacrament of Penance is to be available in all churches from 5:00 p.m - 6:30 p.m.

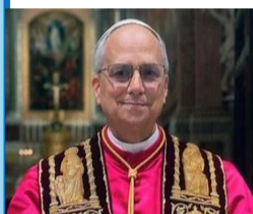
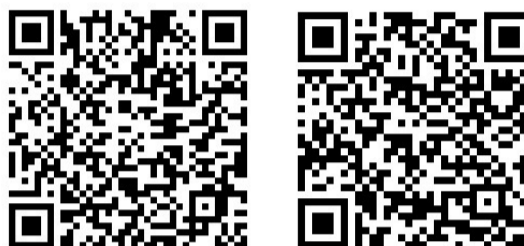
FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

In today's first reading, the LORD asserts that God does not see how people see. We tend to see appearances, but God looks into the heart. How often do we find ourselves unable to see past appearances: the way someone looks, or sounds, or acts? In doing so, are we showing unconscious biases, prejudices, or assumptions? Let us not be like the Pharisees in the Gospel who become indignant when questioning the man who once was blind. They cannot see past their belief that the man must have been born in sin. Nor can they look past the fact that Jesus happened to heal this man on the sabbath. These preconceived judgments blind them to the wonders of God, revealed in Christ.
