REFLECTIONS

Dear Sisters, Brothers, and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings to you all, and praise the Lord.

The Humble King Who Saves

Today, Palm Sunday, begins Holy Week, the most sacred week of the Church year. The liturgy brings both joy and sorrow as Christ enters Jerusalem as King, yet walks toward the Cross for the salvation of the world.

The first reading from Isaiah (50:4–7) presents the image of the suffering servant. He listens faithfully to God, even while facing insults, rejection, and pain. Yet he does not turn back, because his trust remains in the Lord. This prophecy finds its fulfillment in Jesus, who willingly accepts suffering out of love.

The second reading from Philippians (2:6–11) reveals the deep humility of Christ. Though He was in the form of God, He emptied Himself, taking the form of a servant. He humbled Himself even to death on a Cross. Because of this obedience, God exalted Him, and every knee shall bend at the name of Jesus. The path of glory passes through sacrifice.

The Gospel account (Matthew 26:14–27:66) brings the Passion story: betrayal, arrest, trial, suffering, crucifixion, and burial. Jesus is mocked, condemned, and abandoned, yet He remains faithful. His silence before His accusers shows strength, and His Cross becomes the throne of mercy.

Palm Sunday reminds that the crowds who shout “Hosanna” quickly turn to “Crucify Him.” Human hearts can be unstable, yet Christ’s love remains constant. Holy Week calls every believer to walk closely with Jesus, to reflect on the cost of redemption, and to recognize the depth of God’s mercy.

The Cross is not defeat but victory. Through suffering, Christ brings forgiveness. Through death, He opens the way to resurrection. This week invites prayer, repentance, and gratitude for the Savior who gave everything.

May this Palm Sunday lead into Holy Week with renewed faith, humility, and love for the King who saves through the Cross.

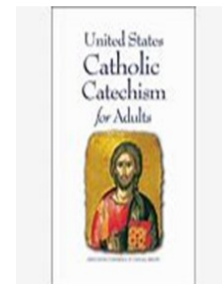


OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)

OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is the Church’s process for preparing adults (and older teens) who are not yet Catholic—or who have not completed their sacraments—to become fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

OCIA is for those who are:

- not baptized,
- baptized in another Christian tradition, or
- baptized Catholic but have not received First Holy Communion and/or Confirmation.



Through OCIA, participants learn the Catholic faith and prepare to receive the sacraments of Baptism (if needed), First Holy Communion, and Confirmation.

Our parish OCIA program is a meaningful sign of evangelization—people are responding to Christ and seeking a deeper relationship with Him through the Church. We warmly welcome anyone interested in becoming Catholic or simply learning more about the Catholic faith. Every inquiry is a reminder that God continues to draw hearts toward deeper faith and sacramental life.

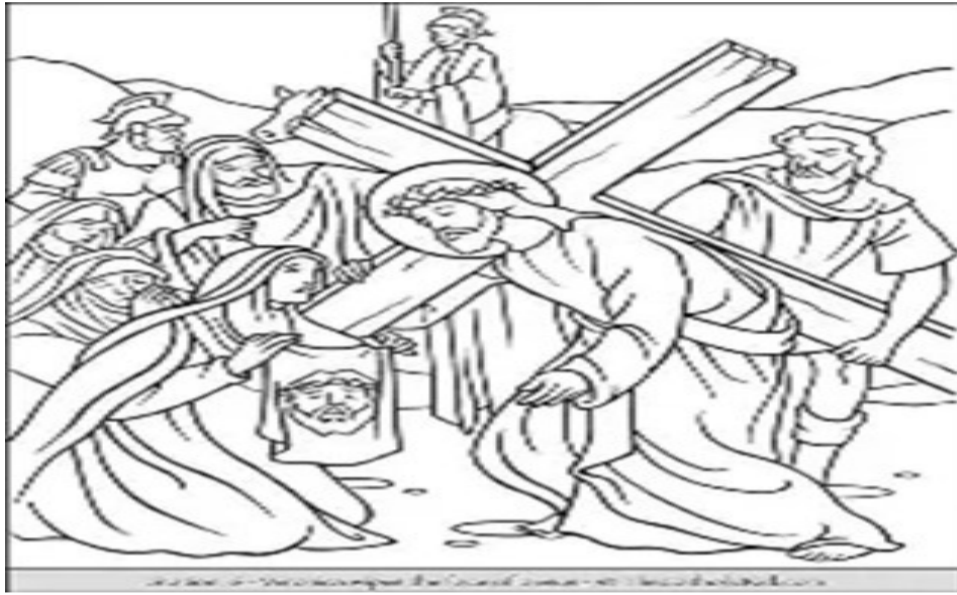

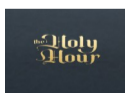

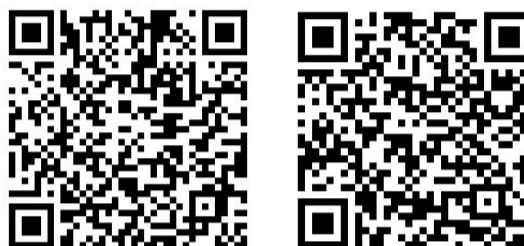
PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

The drama builds throughout this short Gospel, as a larger and larger audience realizes that Jesus is the Messiah. First, it is only the two disciples who are told to get an ass and a colt as they approach Jerusalem, in order to fulfill the prophecy that the Messiah will enter the holy city on these two beasts of burden. Then the crowds spread their cloaks and tree branches on the road as they cry “Hosannas” to Jesus, acknowledging him as the messianic king. Finally, Matthew writes that “the whole city was shaken” (Matthew 21:10), foreshadowing the earth quaking upon Jesus’ death on the cross. The crowds bear witness to the entire city that this is the prophet, the Nazorean, which to people who knew the prophecies of the Old Testament, as Matthew understood them, means that he is the Messiah. This all foreshadows how Jesus’ identity is immediately revealed when he dies. At that moment, the whole world quakes and the soldiers who had just mocked him recognize him as the Son of God. Jesus Christ continues to be revealed today through the words and actions of those who believe.
