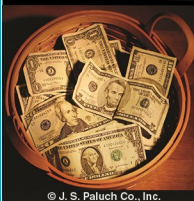

REFLECTIONS

Dear Sisters, Brothers, and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings to you all, and praise the Lord.

Sent Forth with Hope

Today, the Church celebrates the Ascension of the Lord, a glorious feast marking Christ's return to the Father and the beginning of the Church's mission to the world.

The first reading from Acts (1:1–11) describes Jesus ascending into heaven before His disciples. After the Resurrection, He spent forty days teaching them about the Kingdom of God. As they watched Him rise, two angels reminded them that Jesus will one day return in glory. The Ascension is not an ending but a new beginning, showing that Christ reigns with the Father while remaining close to His people.

The second reading from Ephesians (1:17–23) reveals the greatness of Christ's authority. St. Paul prays that believers may understand the hope of God's calling and the immeasurable power at work within them. Christ is seated above all rulers and powers, and God has placed everything under His feet. The Ascension proclaims that Jesus is Lord of heaven and earth.

The Gospel (Matthew 28:16–20) gives the Great Commission. Jesus tells His disciples: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations." He commands them to baptize, teach, and continue His mission. These words are not only for the apostles but for the entire Church. Every believer is called to witness the Gospel through faith, service, and love.

The Ascension reminds that Christianity is a mission, not simply a tradition. Christ entrusts His followers with the responsibility of bringing His light to the world. Though He ascends, He does not abandon them. His promise remains: "I am with you always, until the end of the age."

This feast inspires hope, courage, and commitment. The risen Lord reigns in glory and sends His people forth empowered by the Spirit.

May this celebration strengthen faith and renew dedication to proclaim Christ in every place and circumstance.

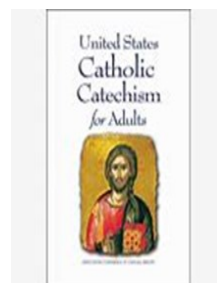


OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults)

OCIA stands for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is the Church’s process for preparing adults (and older teens) who are not yet Catholic—or who have not completed their sacraments—to become fully initiated into the Catholic faith.

OCIA is for those who are:

not baptized,
baptized in another Christian
tradition, or
baptized Catholic but have not
received First Holy
Communion and/or
Confirmation.



Through OCIA, participants learn the Catholic faith and prepare to receive the sacraments of Baptism (if needed), First Holy Communion, and Confirmation.

Our parish OCIA program is a meaningful sign of evangelization—people are responding to Christ and seeking a deeper relationship with Him through the Church. We warmly welcome anyone interested in becoming Catholic or simply learning more about the Catholic faith. Every inquiry is a reminder that God continues to draw hearts toward deeper faith and sacramental life.

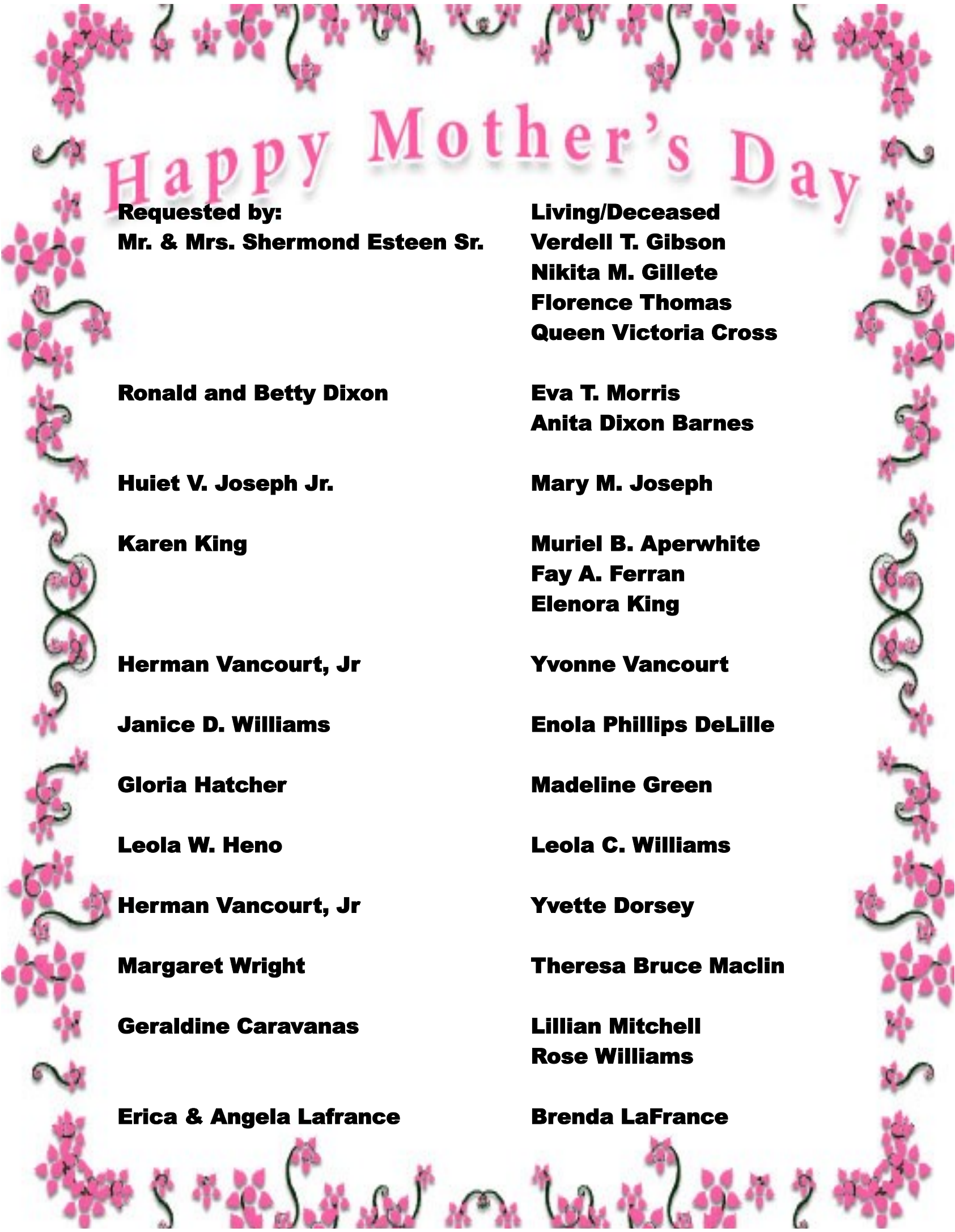

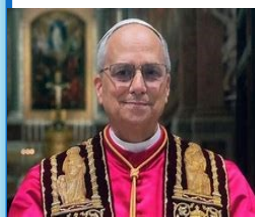
REFLECTION
ASCENSION OF THE LORD

How often have we wished that Jesus would come down from heaven and do something about the terrible things going on in the world today? Such a thought fundamentally misunderstands two lessons from today's readings. First of all, Jesus is already with us. As he promised his disciples, he is with us always, only not in the flesh any longer. Secondly, solving all the world's problems is not why Jesus came in the first place. He did not solve all the world's problems in 30 AD either. He did not bring peace between nations or harmony between peoples. He did not bring miracle cures that could wipe out diseases or disabilities. He did not bring prosperity and happiness to the whole world. No, he joined us in our human condition to share our suffering, redeem us from our sins, and lead us to eternal life with God. What he accomplished transcends the problems of every age, no matter how serious they are. It is now up to us, with the Lord's help, to do what we can to solve the world's problems, if only a little at a time.
