lines for Holy Communion. After Mass ends, you'll collect the worship aids and distribute the weekend bulletins as people leave.

I am deeply grateful to those who have served the usher ministry for many years, and while I hope you will consider this new opportunity to serve, I would like to invite more of you to assist with this ministry. Ideally, we would have four ambassadors at each weekend Mass. The more volunteers we have, the more life-giving this ministry will be for those who encounter you. Eucharistic Adoration

On Thursdays, we will focus on Eucharistic Adoration. Adoration will begin after the 7:45am Mass (approximately 8:30am) and will continue throughout the day until the evening, at a time that is still to be determined. We'll end the evening with Vespers, followed by Benediction. In order for this endeavor to be successful, we will need people committed to adoring the Eucharistic Lord throughout the day and into the evening. Please consider a commitment of time for a half hour or an hour to ensure that there is always someone present with the Lord during the hours of adoration.

Updates around campus

This past week, the final steel beams were installed in the bell tower. Once the finishing touches are put on the installation, we'll be ready to raise the bells into the tower.

Extensive work was completed on the second floor of the rectory with the installation of new shower walls. When the old showers were demoed, it was discovered that several of them had significant rotting occurring in the subfloor. These issues have been corrected, and we've chosen materials that give the suite bathrooms a light, airy feeling. They turned out beautifully!

Ongoing liturgical painting continues in the church to complete the remaining areas where painted finishes are needed. I

know that many of you are eager to see the changes in person. We're working to button up a few remaining items to ensure that the space is clear of safety hazards. We have to be very careful with safety as it is paramount for our insurance carrier, who conducts regular inspections. As soon as we're able to open the space, we'll happily do so!

A number of you have asked about the traffic light at the corner of Hudson St. and Atwood Ave. The absence of that light makes it more difficult to exit onto Atwood Ave. during busy times of the day. I inquired with the city's traffic engineering division, and was told that they are currently working on programming the signals. The hope is to install the signals in the next two to three weeks. The new signals should be functional by Thanksgiving.

Giving ourselves totally to God

Last week Wednesday, we commemorated the memorial of Pope St. John Paul II. It has been 20 years since his passing in 2005. His motto, *Totus Tuus*, moved the hearts of so many. It's a Latin phrase which means "totally yours." It's the spiritual desire that we all have: to give ourselves totally and completely to Christ, including those areas of our life where we'd rather have our own autonomy and control.

Many people are good at giving a portion of their life to God, but God wants all of us! Look at the areas of your life where the veil of darkness might exist through sinful tendencies and behaviors. When we give our entire self to the Lord, the salvific power of the cross is revealed as we stand completely in the light of the Lord's love. St. John Paul is ready to assist us so that we, too, can totally and completely belong to the Lord!

Catholic Considerations for Our Earthly Passing



We prepare for eternal life by choosing to love and follow God. Our journey with Christ includes equipping our consciences to make morally good judgments at the end of life. While no summary can substitute for thorough catechesis, one thing is clear: we are entrusted by God with the gift of life. This obliges us to make use of appropriate, effective medical care. The Church affirms the inviolable dignity of every person, regardless of the duration or extent of the person's incapacity. Nothing diminishes the sanctity of a person's life, or the obligation to protect and care for it. Those who are sick should not be alone, and, even after death, accompaniment continues by praying for those who have passed.

A note about All Saints Day 2025

Due to All Saints Day (November 1) falling on a Saturday this year, the obligation to attend Mass that day has been lifted.

In the U.S., when certain Holy Days of Obligation, such as the Solemnity of All Saints, fall on a Saturday or Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is lifted. However, you are still encouraged to make this a special day. Consider attending daily Mass on Saturday morning, reading about the saints, or saying a prayer to the saints, such as the Litany of Saints. All you holy men and women, pray for us!
