# PASTOR'S PULSE ON THE PARISH

Dear Friends,

**F**or you, O Lord, my soul in stillness waits. Truly, my hope is in you." This phrase isn't biblical, but it is still has profound meaning, and I think it gives great purpose to the meaning of our Advent journey, which begins this weekend.

The Church allows us the next three and a half weeks to ponder the beauty of stillness. In the midst of a fast-paced and busy world, we oftentimes can't comprehend what stillness is - yet alone, practice it! ☺

Stillness can only come with hope, friends, and our hope is secure in the knowledge that the Lord of Lords and Savior of the World will soon be among us again.

## 'Be still and know that I am God'

Before the birth of Christ, both Mary and Joseph had great anxiety as the time for our Lady to have her child was drawing near, and there was no place in which they could lodge to bring our Lord into the world. They ended up in a cold, damp stable, and in that setting of stillness, Jesus came among us: the renewal of our hope made manifest in the little cries that the baby makes.

Our lives are busy, and they become even more so as we journey closer to Christmas. The temptation is to be caught up in that busyness which can bring added stress, anxiety and worry. "Be still and know that I am God." Those are the words of Psalm 46.

If we truly believe in our hearts that our hope is restored in the triumphant coming of the Lord, we allow that calm stillness to fill our hearts amidst the many worries and anxieties of this life. Christ came into the world so that we might come to Him. Rest in that knowledge, friends, and let the stillness of these days bear much fruit!

Our bell company will be here at the beginning of December to do their initial programming on the bells ... I'll try to capture the video where they peal for the first time. After the testing is completed, the bells will remain silent until the Mass of Consecration, where they will peal for the first time at the singing of the Gloria.

The first of the new lighting fixtures have been hung in the east transept, and they look fantastic! The remaining fixtures will be hung over the coming weeks.

Work is continuing on the altar predella with the addition of marble tile. The sacristy keyway ramp is completely finished now, and framing is almost complete in the parking lot entrance


## LIVES OF THE SAINTS

December 3, 2025

### St. Francis Xavier

The Church celebrates the Memorial of St. Francis Xavier (1506-1552), who was born in the castle of Xavier in Navarre, Spain. In 1525 he went to Paris where he met St. Ignatius Loyola and with whom he received Holy Orders in Venice in 1537. In 1540 he was sent to evangelize India. He labored in western India, the island of Ceylon, Malacca, Molucca Islands, island of Mindanao (Philippines), and Japan. In 1552 he started on a voyage to China but died on Sancian Island.
