Help Boost Kids' Safety, Privacy, and Security

When kids start to go online, whether they're playing multiplayer games, using educational apps, or just following their curiosity on Google, it's important that they understand the basics of online privacy and safety. With some general guidelines around what information is and isn't OK to share, and some help from parents when they're unsure, kids can have fun and learn a lot in the digital world.

Check out these 5 tips 

1

Discuss personal vs. private info.

Talk about the difference between what's OK to share online (favorite color) and what's not (home address).

2

Use privacy settings.

Together, go through the settings on all new apps to make sure you both know what information your kids are sharing. Especially in the beginning, it's better to share very little.

3

Avoid location tracking.

Location-aware apps can be super helpful. But apps that use a device's location to help people find your kid or offer them ads for nearby businesses should be used with caution. Turn them off if you can.

4

Power up passwords.

Work together with kids to help them come up with complex passwords. Think outside the dictionary. Use phrases and special characters that make passwords hard to guess but easy to remember. Remind kids to keep passwords private and change them regularly.

5

Skip quizzes.

Help kids identify and avoid clickbait, quizzes, special offers, and anything that asks for personal or private information. This helps keep information secure and devices safe.

Help Boost Kids' Safety, Privacy, and Security

When kids go online, whether they're playing multiplayer games, using social media apps, or posting their latest creative expressions, it's important that they understand how to keep their private information safe. With tips on how to avoid scams and protect their personal data, tweens and teens can travel all over the digital world -- and still be in charge of their digital footprints.

Check out these 4 tips 

1

Use privacy settings.

Sit down with tweens and teens to show the privacy settings you use on your apps and devices. Talk about why you keep certain information private or limited to a small group. Ask them what information they feel comfortable sharing and why.

2

Read the fine print.

Find the privacy policy of your kid's favorite app and read it together. Is it clear or complicated? Can you tell what information the company collects and what they do with it? Are they selling it? Storing it? Keeping it safe?

3

Discuss online scams, clickbait, and "special offers."

Share experiences of being targeted for a scam. Have either of you ever received a fishy email or text? What tipped you off? Discuss the telltale signs of a hoax, including poor grammar, misspellings, Photoshopped images, and close-but-not-exact company logos. And don't forget quizzes and tantalizing pop-ups, which can disguise shady privacy practices.

4

Understand how tech companies make money.

Along with your tween and teen, research how digital devices, social media platforms, and apps and games get paid. Do they sell ads? Do they sell kids' data? What steps can you take to limit the amount of data you share while still using the platforms?

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING THE CJB PARKING LOT DISMISSAL PROCEDURE

Weeks ago, we informed our families that Orland Hills Police Department installed **“NO PARKING”** signs in the neighborhood behind CJB School – in particular on Park Place and Haven Court. This was in response to the overwhelming number of CJB students being picked up in the neighborhood by vehicles that block mailboxes and driveways, double-park, and generally drive unsafely. Vehicles have even parked in resident driveways.

Many of the residents in the area are elderly or have health concerns that make it important for them to be able to leave their home. The residents would like to be able to leave their driveways whenever they wish. Residents have called and have also visited the school over the past week and are asking for us to cooperate and do better.

To our CJB families,

We are experiencing a tremendous amount of traffic issues so far this year, and I am fielding many phone calls and complaints from the CJB community and our neighbors. When it comes to dropping off and picking up, please adhere to the following guidelines, all of which are put in place for the safety of our students. This is the most important priority here at CJB.

Morning drop-off:

- Cars are only to enter from Haven Ave. for the car drop-off line.
- Cars are only to enter from 94th Ave. to park and walk to O'Mara Hall doors (cafeteria).
- **No cars should enter from 167th, as this is the exit for the drop-off line.**

Afternoon pickup:

- Cars are only to enter from 167th for grades K-8, but can park in either the east or west lots.
- PreK pickup enters only from 94th Ave. and parks in the far west lot.
- **No cars should enter from Haven Ave, as this is the exit for the pickup line.**
- **No cars are to park in the subdivision to the south of the school. OHPD has installed no parking signs is ticketing for this.**

Thank you so much for your cooperation and support of these procedures. I am certain that together we can ensure the safety of our students.

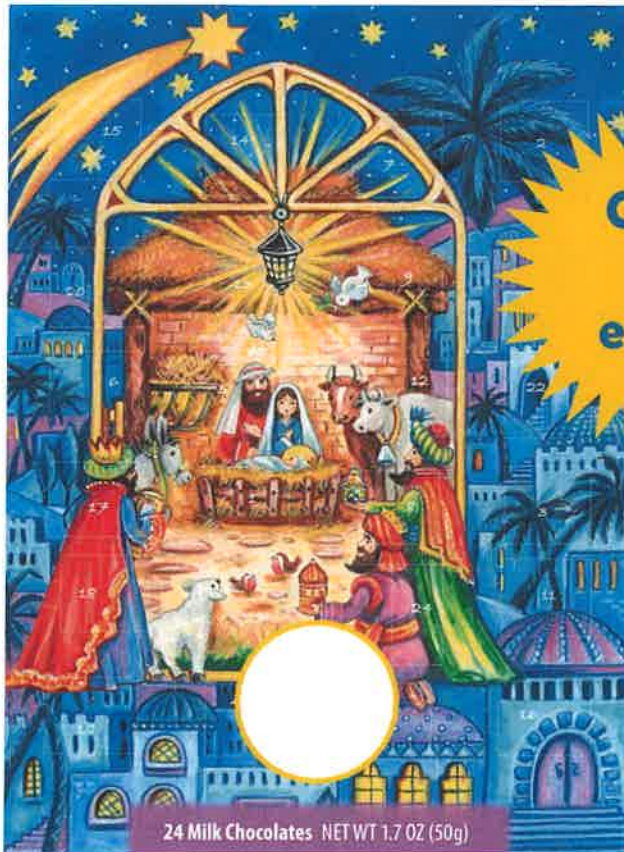
24-Day Chocolate Birth of Christ Advent Calendar
