

# From the Pastor's Desk . . .

**Remember** Memorial Day is always a poignant day, a time to mourn the dead of war, a time to be thankful for them and the freedoms for which they died. It is a time to teach all children that America is still good.



To all the soldiers, sailors, Marines, airmen, Merchant Marines, Coast Guardsmen and everyone else who has given their life to serve the United States of America or to achieve the freedom of others from tyranny, we remember!



Enjoy the holiday, yes. The parade will be fun, but don't forget the reason for it, the nature of it. Teach children true patriotism. It must happen in the family.

Forgive this, but the rest of the column today is about priests.

**Prayers** A few weeks ago I was at a Funeral Mass in another parish. When it was over I was speaking with a lady who is a parishioner there. After a few minutes she told me that she prays for priests, specifically and by name. She said there is a group of people who pray for a priest, usually the pastor (for which I am grateful), in various parishes. Then she reached into her pocket and presented me with a page with a very beautiful prayer on it... both sides, single-spaced.

I thanked her for giving me that and for praying so much for her priests. Now, I present it to you in the event that someone may wish to pray for me or Fr. Denis, or Fr. Gerry or Fr. Mathew, or any other priest! Or for all priests! I will have it placed in the bulletin this week as an insert! I do so with humility and gratitude. What a nice thing it is! Yes, I guess sometimes prayer demands action, whether doing a work of mercy or buying yourself a pony.

**Swiftly fly the years** Speaking of priests, this week I will observe anniversary number 42. Here is the moment of ordination to the priesthood by Archbishop Peter Leo Gerety:





The Apostles conferred the priestly office by the laying on of hands, and so has it been for twenty centuries. After the laying on of hands, one is vested in stole and chasuble, the priestly vestments. Then, the new priest's hands are anointed with sacred chrism, setting them apart to do God's work (right photo). It has been the greatest gift in my life, of course. And the greatest responsibility.

This year, in fact yesterday, May 27, four priests were ordained for the Newark Archdiocese. In my year we had 18. Here is a photo of the newly ordained during the Mass in 1981. The arrow points to me, partially obscured in the second row. To the far right of me is Fr. Dennehy. Only he and I remain actively assigned. Others have died, retired, or sadly, left.


