
From the Pastor's Desk...

Feast Day Last Sunday several hundred parishioners and pilgrims from three states rejoiced as we celebrated the feast day of our own Saint Philomena, virgin and martyr of the early fourth century. Here is a photo (by Steve Pierinelli) of the front of the long line of the faithful, as the procession approached the Shrine on the south side of the Church.



I thank all who took part and all who were present via our live stream. I love your devotion to our patroness.

Off to college? As summer wanes and autumn approaches many of our parish families have loved ones who will go off to school and what has traditionally been called "higher learning." I wax philosophical, or is it my paternal instinct? — and I desire to offer some practical advice, especially to those going to college. I have spent many years of my life on campus as a student and as a priest administrator of our Seminary. As a priest it is my duty and as your pastor, an expression of my love for the sheep of this great flock of Saint Philomena. So here are some thoughts:



It is good and enjoyable to be young. It is also quite difficult at times. That is a fact of life and it is good to learn that if you experience struggle and tough times, that does not mean that you are not blessed. You are simply human, and you are indeed blessed!

Go to school in search of Truth. Listen and evaluate, with good judgment and with Christ as the foundation of your decisions. Others will try to influence your thinking. Yes, a college can be remarkably patronizing, and will often expect you to be a follower of a particular ideology or political agenda, rather than a leader.

Question the "expected" thinking. Have convictions and be judicious in expressing them. Do not seek confrontation. Prudence is an ingredient of wisdom.

To be a leader demands that you be honest with yourself. As Shakespeare put it, "This above all, to thine own self be true." Your judgments must be good judgments. Remember who and what you are, and as a priest told me in confession several decades ago, "Remember your dignity." That is a smart three-word bit of advice for all.

Pope Benedict XVI was a very wise man. He said that the human person "is not some casual and meaningless product of evolution. Each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed, each of us is loved, each of us is necessary." We must all believe that!

To be a leader, protect your soul. Keep the Catholic Faith and live it. In so doing you will be part of a tiny minority. But you will be in the light of Truth and very close to Jesus. Life is better when lived this way. You will be happier with the Gospel than those who are swept up into the predictable liberal and boring ideologies that thrive on campus. With regard to the Faith, if you seek the truth, then be sure to have the <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u>. When you humbly live the Faith your peers will secretly respect you, knowing that they too should live at a higher level. There is nothing that can replace the Sacraments.

Nourish your mind with wisdom and classical truth. This will help you to be reasonable and realistic, not strident and shrill. Think with your mind, not just with AI or websites. Accept nothing that cheapens human life or distorts common sense. Not every ideology is compatible with Christianity. Jesus said that his disciples would meet opposition and endure persecution.

Be a good friend and you will likely have good friends. Practice the art of listening, especially to people with burdens. Ask good questions in class, for questions are at least as important as answers. Never cut a class for any reason. Every single class costs a fortune, so cutting is simply stealing from whomever is paying your tuition.



Nothing good will happen after 10:00 pm. Beware of bad decisions with regard to relationships, substance abuse, and more. Observe the Ten Commandments. Keep them all. Do not violate the sabbath (Third Commandment). Let Sunday be the most joyful day of the week. When one abandons the sabbath, many other sins easily follow. Remember the Fourth, and truly honor and love your parents who are sacrificing to send you to college. Remember the

Great Commandments of Christ: to love God with all that is in you, and all people as yourself! This is key to a happy, healthy and complete life.

And finally, volunteer at least a couple of hours a week, no matter how busy you are, at a soup kitchen or shelter, hospital or nursing home. This will be formational in a very positive, personal way, and it will be very rewarding.

These few thoughts are offered sincerely. It is a privilege to be in school and the day will come that you miss it. Our young parishioners remain important to us when they are away. Saint Philomena Parish has long arms to embrace our students all over the world.

Missions Next weekend our parish will have a guest priest representing the Diocese of Mamfe, Cameroon. Part of my work with the Pontifical Mission Societies involves the Missionary Cooperation Plan of the Society for the Propagation of

the Faith. I assign missionary priests, religious sisters or lay organizations to parishes to make the annual Mission Appeal.



More than any other parish in the Archdiocese, ours is connected to the mission Church. I hope you will consider a generous gift in next weekend's appeal (second collection basket at the doors). Mamfe is a "young" diocese, having been founded only in 1999 by Pope John Paul II. The Bishop of Mamfe, in his letter requesting help, indicates that some of his priests have no place to live, so they stay with families. The Diocese runs several primary and nursery schools, "but the structures are so dilapidated that we are afraid

that some may fall on the children." They are also trying to build a youth center for young people to learn a trade and deepen their faith.

I wouldn't invite them here if this were not a worthy cause. I thank you so much! If you make a donation by check, it should be payable to St. Philomena Church with a notation for the <u>Missions in Cameroon</u>.


