

THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD:

"I Am With You Always!"

Friends, as I look back on my anniversary of ordination and Mother's Day last Sunday, I am grateful for so much. It's hard to believe that I have been a priest for 35 years! Throughout it all, Saint Jude Parish has been an important part of my life, going back to my childhood when we lived right up Highland Road on Wylie Drive. Since it was Mother's Day, and since I have a niece and nephew both graduating from LSU on this week, my family and I decided to wait until next week to do an anniversary celebration. In looking back over these years, I thought I would offer a few perceptions about some of the changes in the world around us that I have noticed and experienced. I have served at St. Isidore Parish in Baker, St. Jude the first time (as Fr. Mike's associate), Most Blessed Sacrament Parish here in Baton Rouge, and then as pastor of the shared pastorate of St. Anne, Assumption, and St. Philomena Parishes in Napoleonville, Plattenville, and Labadieville. For these past 13 years I have served here with you, and it has been an amazing experience. Things were different in almost every way imaginable back in 1988 when I was ordained. Cell phones were just coming out and only available in "bag phone" format. There were nowhere nearly as many channels available on regular TV. There were no Facebook, no Snapchat, no Instagram and the like. There was no text-messaging, Tik-Tok, or internet, at least as we know it today. Fax machines, ditto machines, old-fashioned copier machines were still in use everywhere. And when we produced our weekly parish bulletin, it was done in the parish office workroom, on "real" paper, cut and pasted by hand, and then personally delivered to a local printer. Masses were pretty much packed across the board. If your church offered a youth ministry (youth group) activity, the sign-up was so strong, that we at times almost had to turn people down. Volunteerism was exceptionally strong, both for church and school. Many stores closed on Sundays. And the pace of life was slower. Now, here we are in 2023, and life for all of us is about as ramped-up in speed as it ever has been before. The "disease of busyness," as Thomas Merton called it, affects all of us, even our children. People are good people. People love God. People are deeply, genuinely spiritual. But religion and "going to church" is not the priority for many that it was in the past. Sports take the place of worship. Club meetings, other competitions in other areas of life not only take up so much of our time—and that of our children—it leaves many feeling exhausted. A lot of our children, especially at the middle school and high school levels, don't get enough sleep at night. Tons of people suffer from "F.O.M.O." and feel the need of remaining constantly connected to everyone and everything "out there." Many suffer emotionally from this. And then there's the reality of war in the world, gun violence on our streets, in our schools, and even in malls and places of worship. Sometimes we find ourselves wondering, maybe, "where's it all heading?" Here's my thought about the type of attitude we are called to take toward the landscape of life: perhaps now more than ever we need to hear the words of Jesus to his disciples in today's Gospel: "Go and make disciples of all the nations...and know that I am with you until the end of the age." As we celebrate this Ascension Sunday, and as we continue to live life and seek happiness, I invite us to renew our belief in Christ's promise; namely, that we are never alone. God will always provide. God is ever faithful. The world will continue to change, but God's connection to us, love for us, and protection over us will not.

ATTENTION PARENTS OF CHILDREN AT ST. JUDE SCHOOL

In order to qualify for the Identified Stewardship Giver (ISG) admission bracket and corresponding lower tuition rate for the upcoming school year, you must have met the minimum identifiable amount of \$300.00 given through the Church offertory collection using the envelopes or the portal for online giving. Contributions must be made by December 20, 2023 to count towards the 2024-2025 application year.

A Catholic family, whether in-parish or out of parish, is defined as "a family in which one or both head(s) of the household are baptized Catholic and registered in a church parish."

A Catholic in-parish family (in other words, members of St. Jude Parish) is defined as, "a family in which one or both head(s) of the household are baptized Catholic and registered in St. Jude Parish, by way of our Parish Census Process."

A non-Catholic family is defined as, "a family in which neither of the heads of household are a baptized Catholic." Please note that a non-Catholic family cannot register as a member of St. Jude Parish. Also note, that, a non-Catholic family cannot request to have their child baptized, simply in order to be eligible for the Catholic, in-parish rate.

Please note that, if a Catholic family residing in the geographical boundaries of a church parish other than St. Jude wishes to register in our parish, they must receive a letter of permission from the pastor of the parish in which they do reside geographically.


