

"The Remedy of Rest"

(by Fr. Trey Nelson, In Commemoration of the Feast of St. Augustine: August 28)

People are tired and stressed. People are Busy. Some are depressed, angry, sad. Pressure. Anxiety. Happiness.. Excitement. There are moments when we are energized and motivated. There are times when we are confused and frustrated. And some are even exhausted. This may not be you, not right now, at least. But trust me, these words, or some of them, to be sure,

speak to a lot of us. This is reality. It's reality for both young and old alike. All you have to do to realize this is visit any high school campus these days. Watch students changing classes. Many of them look happy and greet you pleasantly, but a lot of them look completely fatigued. Whenever I see this—whenever I perceive it—one of the first things that I always ask myself is, "I wonder how much sleep they got last night." Most of our U.S. culture, not most of the world, is moving at the speed of light. And we start running when we're young. This reality frightens me to no end sometimes. It affects health, happiness, academic or job performance. It affects relationships. And most of all, it affects our spiritual dimension. In attempting to navigate our way through this sea of emotions and physical effects, there are times, perhaps, when maybe we need to consult a physician or a counselor of some sort. There is, at times even, the need for some type of properly prescribed medication. There are also, however, those extremely unhealthy things that some of us turn to for relief. We may feel good in the moment, but for the long-term, it's only a momentary, artificial relief

Saint Augustine was one of the most significant persons in the history of our church and the Christian faith in general. One of his statements that we commonly recall is this one: "our hearts are restless, O God, until we rest in Thee." Of all the remedies available to us in this world of ours—for peace and comfort—there is one remedy that has been and will always be paramount. And that remedy is rest. Augustine was so right. Throughout my entire life, especially whenever I'm feeling run down and borderline sick, my Mom has always said to me, simply, "rest is a wonderful thing." And she's right. NOTHING takes the place of it. Sleep. A round of golf. Coffee with a friend. Walking, running, or just simply sitting on the porch. All of these sorts of things are absolutely essential to a happy, healthy life. But the most important form of rest to which Augustine refers is that of resting in God's presence. Nothing, nothing at all can take the place of this, even though we subconsciously (and consciously, at times) try to fill the void with something else. Here's an example of why this "resting in God's presence" can be so hard to come by at times. Many, many people go crazy if they have to be separated from their cell phone. Me? I don't. Take my phone? Go ahead, take it! (Well, sort of.) Who ever said that we have to be totally available, all the time? Dr. Bill Jenkins, formerly of LSU, use to tell me that he and his wife would play golf together weekly and that he called it, "the great disconnect."

What's your great disconnect? What type of rest—good, quality, holy rest—are you lacking? Because it truly is a wonderful thing. Thank you, St. Augustine. Thank you, Mom.

PRAYING CHRISTIAN VIRTUES

St. Jude will be presenting an Ignatian prayer series called "Lord Teach Me to Pray-Praying Christian Virtues." This 12-week prayer series introduces Ignatian prayer and spirituality in the way that St. Ignatius himself introduced it to people. Praying Christian Virtues is conducted in a small group setting (12-15 women) with a trained facilitator. 


