She reiterated the beautiful providential relationship between herself, the order, and myself, Queen of Peace and Bishop Daniel. She loves what we are doing here at Queen of Peace. She thinks it is really special and wants to be a part of it. But unfortunately, they just don't have the sisters available to open a new convent. She was disappointed that she couldn't accept our invitation.

So, now Bishop and I will begin to reach out to other religious orders. And therefore, we have returned our parish intention to, "That the Lord would once again send religious sisters to serve Queen of Peace Parish and School."

10 AMAZING FACTS ABOUT THE POWER OF THE EUCHARIST

1) Union with Christ: Reception of Jesus in the Eucharist fuses our being with that of Christ. St. Cyril of Alexandria describes it as similar to "when melted wax is fused with other wax." The Christian journey is a journey to become like Christ. The Eucharist is the means for this to happen.

2) Destruction of venial sin: The Eucharist destroys venial sin. Destroys! Through sin, the fervor of our charity can be dampened by venial sin. But when we receive the Eucharist, we are united with Charity himself, which burns away the vestiges of our venial sins and leaves us cleansed and ready to begin again.

3) Preservation from mortal sin: While we must refrain from receiving the Eucharist when we are aware of being in a state of mortal sin, we should receive the Eucharist as much as possible when we are able because it preserves us from grave sin. It is as if the Eucharist's power washes away the venial sin in our souls and then covers us with a protective coat which helps us to stay away from serious sin.

4) Intimate relationship with Jesus: Many Christians speak of the importance of a personal relationship with Jesus, which is very true. But it is primarily through the Eucharist that we can truly have an intimate encounter with the Person of Jesus.

5) Gives life: According to the Catechism, the Eucharist "preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism" (CCC 1392). In other words, reception of the Eucharist increases the life of grace already present within us.

6) Unity with the Body of Christ: Since we are united more closely to Christ through the Eucharist, we are therefore united more closely to all the other people who receive the Eucharist!

7) Commits us to the poor: Recognizing our unity with the Body of Christ, we also recognize our responsibility to serve and assist our brothers and sisters in need.

8) Spiritual consolation: Holy Communion is a foretaste of the joys of heaven, so it can produce joy in us as we experience real unity with God. If we are feeling beaten down by the difficulties of life, we can come to the Eucharist, our font of joy, and ask the Lord to fill us with his consolation and peace.

9) Peacemaking: In the Synod on the Eucharist in 2005, the bishops discussed how the reception of the Eucharist in war-torn areas transformed the people of God and gave them the impetus to seek peace:

"Thanks to eucharistic celebrations, peoples engaged in conflict have been able to gather around the word of God, hear his prophetic message of reconciliation through gratuitous forgiveness, and receive the grace of conversion which allows them to share in the same bread and cup." (Propositio, 49)

10) Provides a focal point for our lives: If we really understood the profound nature of the Eucharist, we would begin to center our lives around Holy Communion. There is nothing more important that can happen in our lives. Not football games, or get togethers or picnics.

All of these amazing effects and more can be yours every Sunday! Or better yet, try going to daily Mass.

But remember that your disposition when receiving the Eucharist can determine whether you receive these powerful effects. So, be in a state of grace, reverent, focused and beg God to give you, through the power of the Eucharist, all the graces that you need in your life right now!
