FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



OCTOBER, THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

October is the month dedicated to the Rosary. According to an account by fifteenth-century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. The Albigensian heresy was the heresy that all matter was evil, they encouraged sexual abstinence and rejected baptism by water, believing water to be evil. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others. *CatholicCulture.org*

On October 7, 1571, an important naval battle took place off the western coast of Greece near the town of Lepanto. It was between the Holy League, which was a coalition of Southern European Catholic Nations and Ottoman Empire made up of Turkish Muslims. The Holy League of Catholic Nations had come to rescue a colony at the Island of Cyprus which was besieged by the Turks. After five hours of fighting the Holy League won the decisive battle over the Turks. This was an immensely important battle. Some historians and scholars say that a Turkish victory would have allowed the Ottoman Empire to take over Western Europe. This battle has come to be known as the Battle of Lepanto and the victory was credited to the Virgin Mary whose intercession was implored by praying the Rosary.

The Rosary is a very beautiful peaceful, meditative prayer. Although it is vocal prayer, it can be a type of mental prayer in that the familiar words allow us to meditate on the mysteries of Christ's life and to make acts of faith, hope, and charity towards the Lord.

But the rosary isn't just that. It is also a powerful weapon against evil.

St. Padre Pio. Padre Pio was an Italian priest how lived with the stigmata the wounds of Christ. He lived during the 20th century. Well, it is recounted that once during the persecution and unjust treatment St. Padre Pio was experience at the hands of others, he called over to a good friend and said, "Bring me my weapon!" The other friend said sheepishly, "Umm, Father, you are a priest, you cannot have weapons." And Padre Pio responded, "Bring me my rosary. That is my weapon."

We are in the middle of a war. There has been a battle being waged from the beginning of creation. There are visible battles that need to be fought as St. John Paul II said. "There is final confrontation between the gospel and the anti-gospel, the Church and the anti-church." Yes, these battles must be fought, but these are all just symptoms, visible expressions of the real battle.

Listen to St. Paul, "For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens."

Consider adding praying the Rosary to your daily routine. It only takes 15-17 minutes to pray. I try to pray it sometime in the afternoon or evening, but there are times that I leave it to the end of the day, and even if I have to pray it right before bed, it only delays my bedtime by 15 minutes or so which isn't much at all.

Pray the Rosary daily and watch it change your life!
