ear Parishioners,

"You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." Lk. 24 We to have witnessed to Jesus' passion, resurrection, and had the message of redemption preached to us. So let us join the Apostles as they waited in Jerusalem for the Holy Spirit to be poured out upon them after Jesus Ascended into heaven. Let us join them by praying the Holy Spirit Novena, calling upon the Holy Spirit to be poured out upon us that we may be strengthened to give witness to all nations about the work of salvation at work in the Church.

I will be praying with all of you as I lead 5 Religious Sisters of the Hand Maids of the Heart of Jesus on retreat this week in Minnesota. It is a young religious community that is growing rapidly with lots of young women joining the community. A friend of mine introduced them to me early in my priesthood and I have stayed in touch with them ever since.

This weekend we are hosting the Parish Mission Appeal. Every year our parishes host a Mission who give us an opportunity to learn about their service to the poor and they give us an opportunity to help support their work. This year we get to support Hands Together, a key educational and development organization working in Haiti's largest and poorest slum, Cite Soleil. It was started in 1986 by Fr. Tom Hagan after he had led a group of Princeton University students to Haiti and was compelled to respond to the needs of the poor there.

I want to remind all our dedicated volunteers, who help with all the various aspects of parish life, that our parish secretaries will be the primary contact for parish related items and the principals will be the primary contact for school related items. If any volunteers are working with our various vendors for doing business, any contract or business agreements need to be forwarded to the secretary or principal for me to look at before I sign. The secretaries are able to remind me if something hasn't been completed and is time sensitive. Thank you for all that you do to help the parish continue its work of spreading the good news of Jesus Redemption.

The pastorate pastoral council is working with me to do a liturgical workshop in the early fall which will include training for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, Sacristans, and Musicians. Please stay tuned for when that gets scheduled. God bless,

Catholic Corner

he Ascension marks the completion of Jesus' earthly mission. He first united His divine nature with human nature through the Incarnation at the moment of the Annunciation. Saint Thomas Aquinas teaches that from that moment on, Jesus, the Son of God, experienced three types of knowledge. First, being God, He had beatific knowledge, that is, a direct knowledge of His, the Father's, and the Holy Spirit's essence. Second, He had the perfection of infused knowledge, that is, a bestowal of all truths given to the angels in Heaven, especially those truths necessary for the completion of His divine mission. Third, He began to acquire learned knowledge, or experiential knowledge. This was the form of knowledge attained through His human nature from the senses and His human reason.

The final stage of the salvation of humanity will take place when Jesus returns to judge the living and the dead. At that time, every human body will rise, will endure the final purification and transformation, and will share in the new and resurrected state in which the faithful will stand, body and soul, before the Most Holy Trinity and experience the fullness of the Beatific Vision forever. What Jesus has already accomplished in His human form is what we look forward to in hope at the end of time.

The Feast of the Ascension was celebrated annually from as early as apostolic times. When the Council of Nicaea set the date for the celebration of the Resurrection in 325, it chose to keep Easter on the first Sunday after the first full moon occurring on or after the vernal equinox. This decision also placed the Ascension, being forty days after Easter, on a Thursday. Today, many ecclesiastical provinces transfer the celebration to the following Sunday to provide for a wider celebration.


Parish Mission: May 31/June 1 Hands Together


