FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

WE DEPEND ON EACH OTHER

I am back to full-time ministry and very glad to be so. It is going to take some time, however, to be fully back to normal. Thank you for your patience. Along the way I have encountered many other cancer patients and survivors. We have benefitted from each other's stories and support. We all depend on each other. This is also true in marriage. I often tell couples that the most important job for a husband is to help his wife get to heaven and the most important job for a wife is to help her husband get to heaven. This week, I am especially asking married couples to pray together and to reflect on how they support each other in the practice of the faith. For those who are widowed, I ask for the same sort of reflection. Ask your deceased spouse to pray together with you, especially this week. For those who are divorced, pray for your former spouse. For those who have never been married, reflect on how the marriages of those close to you have strengthened your faith. This might be parents or grandparents, brothers or sisters, or close friends. Marriage is part of all of our lives. In the coming weeks' bulletins, I will be offering reflections on Biblical couples and married saints. Next week will focus on Adam and Eve. Let us always be in prayer with and for each other.

SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

As party of the Mary Queen of Heaven Parish Family, we have established the following protocol for Sacramental Emergencies.

What is a Sacramental Emergency?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves—including but not limited to, emergency infant Baptism or Last Rites of someone with dementia.

If someone either has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the beginning of any serious condition—not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**

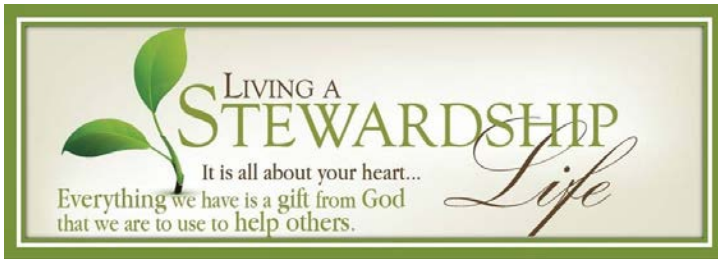

With activities in full swing, we would like to remind all parish/school employees and volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All

employees and volunteers are required to have completed **The Archdiocese of Cincinnati: Protecting Children From Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese Of Cincinnati Edition**. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

Please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. SAINT JEROME

Saint of the Day: September 30

Patron Saint of Librarians, Scholars and Translators

Jerome was above all a Scripture scholar, translating most of the Old Testament from the Hebrew. Jerome also wrote commentaries which are a great source of scriptural inspiration for us today. He was an avid student, a thorough scholar, a prodigious letter-writer and a consultant to monk, bishop, and pope.

Saint Jerome is particularly important for having made a translation of the Bible which came to be called the Vulgate. It is not the most critical edition of the Bible, but its acceptance by the Church was fortunate. The Council of Trent called for a new and corrected edition of the Vulgate, and declared it the authentic text to be used in the Church.

In order to be able to do such work, Saint Jerome prepared himself well. He was a master of Latin, Greek, Hebrew, and Chaldaic. He began his studies at his birthplace, Stridon in Dalmatia. After his preliminary education, he went to Rome, and thence to Trier, Germany, where the scholar was very much in evidence. He spent several years in each place, always trying to find the very best teachers. He once served as private secretary to Pope Damasus.

After these preparatory studies, he traveled extensively in Palestine, marking each spot of Christ's life with an outpouring of devotion. Mystic that he was, he spent five years in the desert of Chalcis so that he might give himself up to prayer, penance, and study. Finally, he settled in Bethlehem, where he lived in the cave believed to have been the birthplace of Christ. Jerome died in Bethlehem, and the remains of his body now lie buried in the Basilica of St. Mary Major in Rome.
