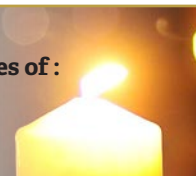

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

MEANT FOR EACH OTHER

The Book of Tobit weaves two stories together. The angel Raphael, disguised in human form, is sent by God to answer the independent prayers of Tobit and Sarah. Both have prayed for death due to their misfortunes. God will give them healing and life. Today, I want to focus on the way God answers Sarah's prayer through her marriage to Tobit's son Tobiah. In their travel, Raphael and Tobiah near the home of Raguel, a relative. Raphael informs Tobiah that Raguel has a beautiful, courteous and wise daughter, who he has the right to marry because they are relatives. Tobiah responds with fear because he has heard that Sarah has been married seven times and that each died on their wedding night. Raphael reassures him and directs him to use a fish liver and heart as incense, and to pray. Tobiah does marry Sarah following Raphael's instructions and the demon that had been afflicting Sarah is expelled. Their marriage is begun in the grace of God. When Raguel sees that Tobiah has not died, he also gives praise to God. Sarah and Tobiah were brought together by God and placed their marriage in God's hands. We are called to center our marriages upon God. Next week will focus on Anne and Joachim the parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus. Let us always be in prayer with and for each other.

SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

As party of the Mary Queen of Heaven Parish Family, we have established the following protocol for Sacramental Emergencies.

What is a Sacramental Emergency?

Sacramental Emergencies are if someone is in imminent danger of dying and wishes to receive the sacraments before passing. This also may include those who are under someone's care and are unable to request the sacraments themselves – including, but not limited to, emergency infant Baptism or Last Rites of someone with dementia. If someone has a chronic illness or is not in imminent danger, please schedule an anointing. It is suggested that the sick person receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at the beginning of any serious condition – not at the end. **If you are in need of a priest or have a Sacramental Emergency after hours, please call 513-369-9820.**

ARCHDIOCESE TWINNING PARISH PROGRAM

St. Ann has partnered with Our Lord of Hope in Lima, Peru for many years as part of the Archdiocese Twinning Parish Program. One of the flagship programs of our twinning parish is Yancana Huasy which provides services for children and young people with disabilities in a highly impoverished area near Lima, called Canto Grande.

The program is dedicated to children born into situations of extreme poverty who have significant physical or mental disabilities. Not only does the program help the children, but the staff also works with the mother or caregiver to teach them ways to care for their children. This allows the parents to come to see their children as the gifts that they are, even with the challenges they have.

The services that Yancana Huasy provides the children allow them to develop mentally, physically, spiritually, and achieve their maximum potential. Besides the physical care, vocational classes and projects are established so the older children and young adults can learn trades, crafts, or find ways

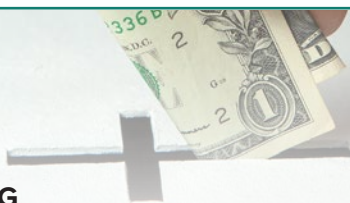
to continue learning and developing. Through all of this, a great sense of community is created.

Funds raised for this project support the goals of Yancana Huasy to bring their staff and services to the farthest regions of this sector within a parish of 300,000 people. The goal is to reach out to everyone who might have babies or children with such needs and provide them with assistance. It will also help bring the children to the Center of Yancana Huasy for their treatments and therapy.

Various times throughout the year, we support them by selling their handmade gifts. In the month of October, items will be available in the Gathering Space at St. Ann on October 11/12 and again on October 25/26. All of the proceeds of these sales benefit the Yancana Huasy mission.

Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish™ quarterly bulletins.

Please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish™ account is approved. 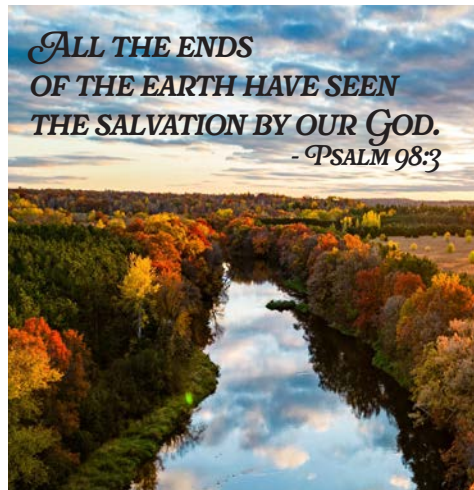
GRATITUDE

Reflection on Luke 17:11-19

Certainly, this story of the cleansing of the ten lepers has something important to say about gratitude, as Jesus points out in the story that only one of the ten returned to give thanks. But the fact that the story is silent about what happened to the other nine is also important. Did they recognize the gift they had received? Were they ungrateful?

What is instructive for us in the story is the fact that the one who did return to give thanks was a foreigner, a Samaritan. Ironically, given the fact that Jesus told them to show themselves to the priests, who by custom were the only ones who could pronounce them cured, the Samaritan is the only one who could not go to the priests. He would not have been welcomed in the temple, because he was a non-believer in the eyes of the Jews.

Perhaps one of the lessons for us in this story is the value of strangers, foreigners, in our midst. God calls all people to Himself. While God's search for us unfolds within the Church, God's search for every one of His children is no less persistent. In lives and beliefs that look strange and foreign to us, God is at work, in God's own way and wisdom. — Father Jay

SAINT CARLO ACUTIS

Saint of the Day: October 12 – Patron Saint of the Internet

Born in London and raised in Milan, Saint Carlo's wealthy parents were not particularly religious. Upon receiving his First Communion at age seven, Carlo became a frequent communicant, making a point of praying before the tabernacle before or after every Mass. In addition to Francis of Assisi, Carlo took several of the younger saints as his models.

At school, Carlo Acutis tried to comfort friends whose parents were undergoing divorce, as well as stepping in to defend disabled students from bullies. After school hours, he volunteered his time with the city's homeless and destitute. Considered a computer geek by some, Carlo spent four years creating a website dedicated to cataloguing every reported Eucharistic miracle around the world. He also enjoyed films, comics, soccer, and playing popular video games.

Diagnosed with leukemia, Carlo offered his sufferings to God for the intentions of the sitting pope—Benedict XVI—and the entire Church. His longtime desire to visit as many sites of Eucharistic miracles as possible was cut short by his illness. Carlo died in 2006 and was beatified in 2020.

As he had wished, Carlo was buried in Assisi at St. Mary Major's "Chapel of the Stripping," where Francis had returned his clothes to his father and began a more radical following of the Gospel.

Among the thousands present for Carlo's beatification at Assisi's Basilica of St. Francis were many of his childhood friends. Presiding at the beatification service, Cardinal Agostino Vallini praised Carlo as an example of how young people can use technology to spread the Gospel "to reach as many people as possible and help them know the beauty of friendship with the Lord."
